A COUNCIL RESOLUTION CONCERNING

1	Baltimore Police Department – Internal Affairs Early Warning Intervention System
2 3	FOR the purpose of requesting the Baltimore Police Department to expand its Internal Affairs Early Warning Intervention System to include retraining officers from each district who have
4	been flagged for intervention in the areas of use of force continuum, citizen interaction, and
5	de-escalation techniques.
6	Recitals
7	As a part of its 2014 Preventing Harm plan the Baltimore Police Department instituted an
8	Early Warning Intervention System for Police Officers who frequently receive complaints against
9	them from citizens.
10	This system is a part of many changes to the Internal Affairs process that also includes adding
11	more detectives to Internal Affairs and the forthcoming changes around the sharing of Internal
12	Affairs Data. However, as the Baltimore Police Department moves forward in its efforts to
13	repair citizen trust and adjust to a new 21 st Century form of policing it is imperative that it keeps
14	pushing the envelope on all fronts, including self-accountability.
15	Improving the Early Warning Intervention System to include retraining officers flagged for
16	the intervention would prove to be another step in improving policing in Baltimore and ensuring
17	the safety of Baltimore's Police Officers and our citizens, which is the chief responsibility of the
18	Baltimore Police Department.
19	Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
20	Council respectfully requests the Baltimore Police Department to expand its Internal Affairs
21	Early Warning Intervention System to include retraining officers who have been flagged for
22	intervention.
23	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Council respectfully requests that the Police
24	Commissioner report to the City Council on the progress of this program annually.
