SITE/GENERAL AREA

<u>Site Conditions</u>: This is a 1200 acre park located in the Southwestern district of the city. The park features several amenities including a miniature steam-powered railroad, the Orianda Mansion, the Carrie Murray Nature Center and over 14 miles of hiking and biking trails.

General Area: The Park touches several residential neighborhoods; Windsor Hills and Wakefield to the north, Fairmount and Rosemount to the east, Franklintown and Hunting Ridge to the west and Edmondson Village and Edgewood to the south. There are many residential neighborhoods that abut the Park with a mixture of single family and multi-family buildings.

HISTORY

There are no previous legislative or Planning Commission actions regarding this site.

ANALYSIS

Heide Grundmann has provided over 30 years of dedicated commitment and service to Gwynns Falls/Leakin Park. In her early years as a neighboring resident, Ms. Grundmann became involved with a group, which opposed the use of the park as a route for the interstate 70. She was one of the founding members that helped transform that advocacy group to become the Friends of Gwynns Falls/Leakin Park Inc. She continues to pursue her love of nature by walking in the park each month with a naturalist.
