11	For many years, Harlem Denison Park was an eyesore to the nearby residents		
12	of the Edgewood Community. With litter scattered throughout the park's open		
13	areas, with cracked sidewalks, and with unsafe, rusted fences, the park provided		
14	negligible worth to the community. This year the blight was removed through the		
15	help of the Parks and People foundation, which invested \$65,000 to improve the		
16	area and to add new features. In the process of revitalizing the area, the		
17	community's input was consulted in partnership with the Baltimore City		
18	Department of Recreation and Parks.		
19	Now the park has green grass, trees, boulders, and a plaza for community		
20	gatherings, and it has improved the image of the community as a whole. The		
21	Edgewood Community believes that Harlem Denison Park should be renamed to		
22	reflect the park's revitalization. The park is presently named for the intersection		
23	of 2 streets adjacent to its boundaries, and the name does not reflect the character		
24	of the community.		
25	One notable resident and Baltimore icon lived in the community. That person		
26	was William Donald Schaefer, former mayor and 58th Governor of Maryland. He		
27	grew up at 620 Edgewood Street and lived there with his mother during most of
