AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Franchise – Bridgeway over Centre Street

- 2 FOR the purpose of granting a franchise to MD-601 N. Calvert, LLC, to use and maintain an
- 3 existing elevated bridgeway that is located above and across Centre Street approximately 120
- 4 feet east of Calvert Street, subject to certain terms, conditions, and reservations; and
- 5 providing for a special effective date.

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Recitals

- Ordinance 599 of 1990 granted permission and authority to The Baltimore Sun Company, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain, and operate at its own expense, for a period not exceeding 25 years, an elevated walkway or bridgeway above and across Centre Street, about 119.54 feet east of the east building line of Calvert Street, which elevated walkway or bridgeway was to connect the existing building of The Baltimore Sun on the north side of Centre Street with the existing building of The Baltimore Sun on the south side of Centre
- 18 Street.
- 19 Since the effective date of the Ordinance, the title of the real property has been 20 transferred, and MD-601 N. Calvert, LLC, is the current owner. Although the 21 original franchise has expired, the franchise fee has continued to be paid. MD-
- 601 N. Calvert, LLC, requests that the franchise be reestablished for an additional
 25 years.
- 24 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That a 25 franchise or right is granted to MD-601 North Calvert, LLC, its tenants, successors, and assigns 26 (collectively, the "Grantee") to use and maintain, at Grantee's own cost and expense, and subject

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to the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, the existing elevated bridgeway above and across
 Calvert Street about 119.54 feet east of the east building line of Calvert Street, which elevated

3 walkway or bridgeway connects the existing building of the Grantee situated on the north side of

4 Centre Street with the existing building of the Grantee situated on the south side of Centre Street.

5 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That to become effective, the franchise or right 6 granted by this Ordinance (the "Franchise") must be executed and enjoyed by the Grantee within 7 6 months after the effective date of this Ordinance.

8 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That as compensation for the Franchise, the 9 Grantee shall pay to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore a franchise charge of \$<u>12,514.60</u> a 10 year, subject to increase or decrease as provided in Section 5 of this Ordinance. The franchise 11 charge must be paid annually, at least 30 days before the initial and each renewal term of the 12 Franchise.

13 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

(a) The initial term of the Franchise is 1 year, commencing on the effective date of this
Ordinance. Unless sooner terminated as provided in this Ordinance, the Franchise will
automatically renew, without any action by either the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore or
the Grantee, for 24 consecutive 1-year renewal terms. Except as otherwise provided in this
Ordinance, each renewal term will be on the same terms and conditions as the initial term. The
maximum duration for which the Franchise may operate, including the initial and all renewal
terms, is 25 years.

(b) Either the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Director of
 Transportation, or the Grantee may cancel the Franchise as at the end of the initial or any renewal
 term by giving written notice of cancellation to the other at least 90 days before the end of that
 term.

(b) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Director of
 Transportation, when, in the Director's reasonable judgment, the public welfare or safety so
 requires, may cancel the Franchise at the end of the initial or any renewal term by giving written
 notice of cancellation to the Grantee at least 90 days before the end of that term.

(c) The Grantee may cancel the Franchise as of the end of the initial or any renewal term by
 giving written notice of cancellation to the Mayor and City Council at least 90 days before the
 end of that term.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Estimates, may increase or decrease the annual franchise charge by giving written notice of the increase or decrease to the Grantee at least 150 days before the end of the original or renewal term immediately preceding the renewal term to which the increase or decrease will first apply. The new franchise charge will apply to all subsequent annual renewal terms, unless again increased or decreased in accordance with this section.

38 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore 39 expressly reserves the right at all times to exercise, in the interest of the public, full municipal 40 superintendence, regulation, and control over and in respect to all matters connected with the 41 Franchise and not inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance.

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SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the Grantee, at its own cost and expense, 1 2 shall maintain in good condition and in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations of 3 Baltimore City, all structures for which the Franchise is granted. The maintenance of these 4 structures shall be at all times subject to the regulation and control of the Commissioner of 5 Housing and Community Development and the Director of Transportation. If any structure for 6 which the Franchise is granted must be readjusted, relocated, protected, or supported to 7 accommodate a public improvement, the Grantee shall pay all costs and expenses in connection 8 with the readjustment, relocation, protection, or support.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at the option of the Mayor and City
 Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Director of Transportation, the Grantee's failure
 to comply with any term or condition of this Ordinance constitutes a forfeiture of the Franchise.
 Immediately on written notice to the Grantee of the exercise of this option, the Franchise
 terminates. Once so terminated, only an ordinance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore
 may waive the forfeiture or otherwise reinstate the Franchise.

15 **SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That at any time and without prior notice, the 16 Mayor of Baltimore City may revoke the Franchise if, in the Mayor's <u>reasonable</u> judgment, the 17 public interest, welfare, safety, or convenience so requires. Immediately on written notice to the 18 Grantee of the exercise of this right, the Franchise terminates.

SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That on cancellation, expiration, forfeiture, revocation, or other termination of the Franchise for any reason, the Grantee shall remove all structures for which the Franchise is granted. The removal of these structures shall be (i) undertaken at the cost and expense of the Grantee, without any compensation from the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, (ii) made in a manner satisfactory to the Commissioner of Housing and Community Development and the Director of Transportation, and (iii) completed within the time specified in writing by the Director of Transportation.

26 **SECTION 11.** AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED. That the Grantee is liable for and shall indemnify and save harmless the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore against all suits, losses, 27 costs, claims, damages, or expenses to which the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is at any 28 29 time subjected on account of, or in any way resulting from, (i) the presence, construction, use, operation, maintenance, alteration, repair, location, relocation, or removal of any of the structures 30 for which the Franchise is granted, or (ii) any failure of the Grantee, its officers, employees, or 31 agents, to perform promptly and properly any duty or obligation imposed on the Grantee by this 32 Ordinance. 33

34 **SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it 35 is enacted.
