





SITE/GENERAL AREA

<u>Site Conditions</u>: The Harlem Denison Park is located at 3421 Harlem Avenue, on the south side of Harlem Avenue, approximately 125' west of the intersection with Denison Street.

General Area: This park is located within the Edgewood neighborhood, a predominantly residential neighborhood, where a majority of the housing stock is comprised of row houses. The neighborhood is bordered by Edmondson Avenue on the south, Mount Holly Street on the west, the Gwynns Falls-Leakin Park on the north, and Hilton Parkway on the east.

HISTORY

There are no previous legislative or Planning Commission actions regarding this site.

ANALYSIS

Background: As captioned in the recitals section of the bill, the Harlem Denison Park had fallen into disrepair over a period of years. Recently, with the help of the Parks and People Foundation's investment of \$65,000, the park has been cleaned and improved in partnership with the Department of Recreation and Parks. The park has been known in name only by the nearest intersection of streets, and residents wanted a new name that reflects the character of the neighborhood. This request is to name the park after William Donald Schaefer, former Mayor of Baltimore City, and 58th Governor of Maryland, who was also a neighborhood resident at 620 Edgewood Street – one block to the west of the park.

Recitals

For many years, Harlem Denison Park was an eyesore to the nearby residents of the Edgewood Community. With litter scattered throughout the park's open areas, with cracked sidewalks, and with unsafe, rusted fences, the park provided negligible worth to the community. This year the blight was removed through the help of the Parks and People foundation, which invested \$65,000 to improve the area and to add new features. In the process of revitalizing the area, the community's input was consulted in partnership with the Baltimore City Department of Recreation and Parks.

Now the park has green grass, trees, boulders, and a plaza for community gatherings, and it has improved the image of the community as a whole. The Edgewood Community believes that Harlem Denison Park should be renamed to reflect the park's revitalization. The park is presently named for the intersection of 2 streets adjacent to its boundaries, and the name does not reflect the character of the community.

One notable resident and Baltimore icon lived in the community. That person was William Donald Schaefer, former mayor and 58th Governor of Maryland. He grew up at 620 Edgewood Street and lived there with his mother during most of his time as mayor, where he was a good neighbor to others in the community. The revitalization of the park is something of which he would have been pleased. The Edgewood Community believes that the park should be renamed to honor him and his legacy.
