

The bill provides that the Mayor and City Council consent to and approve the petition to extend the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County to a tract of land consisting of approximately 27.7932 acres in the 4th Election District of Baltimore County. The bill provides that the ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.


The Metropolitan District of Baltimore County was established by the Metropolitan District Act (hereinafter the "Act"), Chapter 539 of the Acts of 1924 as amended by Chapter 1017 of the Acts of 1945, and Chapter 515 of the Acts of 1955. Under the Act, the City is "required to supply water to consumers in the metropolitan district of Baltimore County at cost and entirely without profit or loss." Baltimore County v. Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, 329 Md. 692, 696 (1993) (internal quotations omitted). See also Public Local Law §§ 25-22 through 25-30. The initial boundaries of the Metropolitan District were set in the Act, but inhabitants in any locality adjoining, but outside of, the Metropolitan District can make a written petition to the County to join the District. See 1924 Laws of Md., Ch. 539 § 14; 1955 Laws of Md., Ch.515, § 1. The petition has to be approved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. Id.; see also Baltimore County Code, Art. 20, §§ 1-101(b), 1-102 (Mayor and City Council must approve any Metropolitan District Extensions); Home Owners' Loan Corp. v. Baltimore City, 175 Md. 676, 680-81 (1939) (City has no duty to supply water outside of its boundaries unless provided by ordinance).

This ordinance is the appropriate legal authorization for the extension of the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County. Subject to confirmation by the Baltimore City Department of Public Works that the applicable requirements have been met to extend the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.







I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 17-0034 introduced by the Administration (Department of Transportation).

The purpose of the Bill is to consent to and approve a petition to extend the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County to a certain tract of land; and providing for a special effective date.

This extension request is for a parcel of land approximately 27.7932 acres in size and located south of Nicodemus Road and northeasterly of and adjacent to Berryman's Lane, in the 4th Election District of Baltimore County, Maryland. It is contiguous to the Metropolitan District and is within the County's Urban Rural Demarcation Line.

Resolution 70-16 approved by the Baltimore County Council on July 5, 2016 found District Extension 165 to meet the requirements for requesting an extension of water service from Baltimore City. The request conforms with the Baltimore County Master Water Supply and Sewerage Plan, the Baltimore County Land Use Master Plan, and the Comprehensive Zoning Map. The property is zoned DR-1, a low density residential zoning classification that permits the development of one residential unit per acre. The development plan approved by Baltimore County for this parcel allows for 24 residential lots to be developed and served by public water and sewer.

A petition for an extension of the Baltimore County Metropolitan District to be valid under Maryland Law must be approved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. This Department has confirmed that the petition request can be adequately served with water from the existing water distribution system. Based on these findings, the Department of Public Works supports passage of City Council Bill 17-0034.

Brief Description of Extension Area: This request would extend the Metropolitan District to a tract of land of approximately 27.7932 acres, located in the vicinity of the northeasterly side of Berryman's Lane, south of Nicodemus Road. The requested expansion is located within the County's Urban-Rural Demarcation Line (URDL).

Purpose of the Request: The petitioner is the owner of the property who is requesting the extension for a low density housing development. Existing zoning allows for this use. The area requested to be served with public water abuts the Metropolitan District along the southerly boundary of the property.

County Action: Resolution 70-16 approved by the County Council on July 5, 2016 found District Extension 165 to meet the requirements for requesting an extension of water service from Baltimore City. The request conforms with the Baltimore County Master Water Supply and Sewerage Plan and the Baltimore County Land Use Master Plan and zoning. The property is zoned DR-1. DR-1 requires public water and sewer utility service and would permit a maximum of one residential unit per acre. The County approved development plan for this parcel permits 24 residential lots to be developed. The affected property owner is the petitioner.

Adequate Service: The proposed extension can be adequately served with water from the Reisterstown 5th Zone.

The Metropolitan District Act (1924), jointly supported by Baltimore City and Baltimore County before the State Legislature, defined geographic limits within Baltimore County whereby the City would develop a water system and supply water to the County, at cost. The Act further allowed for expansion of the District provided 3/5 of the property owners in an area contiguous to the District request it. The Act places no limits on expansion requests. The City's responsibility to supply water to District Extensions was upheld in the Maryland Court of Appeals decision in Dinneen v. Rider, 152 Md. 343 (1927). The Court stated the City is "... directed to make installation of water supply service pipes to be connected to its water mains, whenever and wherever requested..."



ANALYSIS

Current Law

The Metropolitan District Act requires that Baltimore City provide sewer and water services to areas contiguous to its borders in Baltimore County, known as the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County. 1924 Laws of Md., Ch. 539; 1945 Laws of Md., Ch. 1017; 1955 Laws of Md., Ch. 515.

Background

Council Bill 17-0034 allows 27.7932 acres of land to enter the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County. This land is "in the vicinity of the north side of Berrymans Lane" and is better seen "on the plat labeled Extension 165." The Department of Finance provided comments on the Bill, and stated that it does not predict any fiscal impact for the City. Additionally, the Agency noted that 17-0034 was "introduced for the purpose of consenting to and approving of a petition to extend the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County to 24 residential lots to be developed and served by the City's public water and sewer system."

Similarly, the Department of Public Works ("DPW") provided a favorable report, stating that 17-0034 is needed so that a developer in Baltimore County can construct single family homes, which require public sewer and water infrastructure by law. This infrastructure, through the Metropolitan District Act, is provided by Baltimore City along areas contiguous to its borders. DPW "has confirmed that the petition request can be adequately served with water from the existing water distribution system."

The Department of Transportation provided a favorable report, stating that the land in question is "contiguous to the Metropolitan District and is within the County's Urban Rural Demarcation Line." The Department of Planning has no objections to the Bill and defers to the Department of Public Works on the question of the City's utilities. The Law Department provided a favorable report, approving 17-0034 for form and legal sufficiency.
