4	FOR the purpose of requiring certain inspection reports to be posted and maintained on a food
5	service facility's premises; requiring the maintenance of posted suspension notices; defining
6	certain terms; imposing certain civil penalties; and generally relating to the regulation of food
7	service facilities.

23	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
24	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

27	Title 6. Food Service Facilities

**EXPLANATION:** CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

1	Subtitle 1. Definitions; General Provisions
2	§ 6-104. Inspections; samples.
3	(a) Inspections – GENERAL AUTHORIZATION.
4 5 6	The Commissioner, all other officers of the Department, and any inspector or police officer authorized by the Commissioner may, at all reasonable hours, enter, have full access to, and inspect:
7 8	(1) any structure, premises, or vehicle in which food is or is believed to be prepared, manufactured, processed, stored, packaged, handled, or distributed; and
9 10	(2) any railroad car, truck, wagon, or other vehicle that is or is believed to be used for the conveyance or delivery of food.
11	(B) Inspections – Posting report on facility premises.
12	(1) "INSPECTION REPORT" DEFINED.
13 14 15	In this subsection, "inspection report" means the Department's report of a comprehensive or monitoring inspection, as these types of inspection are described in COMAR 10.15.03.30A(1) and (2), respectively.
16	(2) FACILITY TO POST REPORT.
17 18 19	A FOOD SERVICE FACILITY MUST POST A PUBLIC COPY OF ITS MOST RECENT INSPECTION REPORT THROUGHOUT THE PERIOD BEGINNING WITH THE $1^{\rm st}$ BUSINESS DAY AFTER THAT REPORT'S RECEIPT UNTIL THE RECEIPT OF ANY LATER INSPECTION REPORT.
20	(3) FORM AND PLACEMENT.
21	THE POSTED INSPECTION REPORT MUST BE:
22	(I) IN THE FORM AND TENOR THAT THE COMMISSIONER SPECIFIES; AND
23 24	(II) CONSPICUOUSLY PLACED, AS DIRECTED BY THE COMMISSIONER, SO THAT IT IS VISIBLE TO AND CAN BE READ BY PASSING PEDESTRIANS.
25	(4) MAINTENANCE.
26	THE FOOD SERVICE FACILITY:
27 28	(I) MUST ENSURE THAT THE POSTED INSPECTION REPORT IS NOT DEFACED, MARRED, CAMOUFLAGED, OR OBSCURED FROM PUBLIC VIEW; AND
29 30	(II) MAY NOT REFUSE, NEGLECT, OR OTHERWISE FAIL TO MAINTAIN THE POSTED INSPECTION REPORT AS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION

1	(C) [(b)] <i>Samples</i> .
2 3	During any inspection, the Commissioner, officer, inspector, or police officer may take food samples of up to 1 pound of each item for inspection, testing, or analysis.
4	Subtitle 6. Suspensions and Revocations
5	§ 6-606. Public notices.
6	(a) Suspensions – Posting [of] NOTICE ON FACILITY premises.
7	(1) FACILITY TO POST NOTICE.
8 9	A food service facility that has had its license suspended must post a public notice of the suspension throughout the suspension period.
10	(2) FORM, CONTENTS, AND PLACEMENT.
11	The POSTED SUSPENSION notice must:
12	(I) [(ii)] be in the form and tenor that the Commissioner specifies; [and]
13	(II) [(i)] state the term of and reasons for the suspension; AND
14 15	(iii) be conspicuously placed, as directed by the Commissioner, so that it is visible to and can be read by passing pedestrians.
16	(3) MAINTENANCE.
17	THE FOOD SERVICE FACILITY:
18 19	(I) MUST ENSURE THAT THE POSTED SUSPENSION NOTICE IS NOT DEFACED, MARRED, CAMOUFLAGED, OR OBSCURED FROM PUBLIC VIEW; AND
20 21	(II) MAY NOT REFUSE, NEGLECT, OR OTHERWISE FAIL TO MAINTAIN THE POSTED SUSPENSION NOTICE AS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION.
22	(B) [(c)] Suspensions, revocations, and nonrenewals – Website listing.
23	(1) COMMISSIONER TO MAINTAIN LISTING.
24 25 26 27	The Commissioner must maintain, update at least weekly, and publish on the Department's website a list of all food service facilities that, at any time during the preceding calendar month or during the current calendar month to the latest update, have had their licenses suspended, revoked, or denied renewal.
28	(2) REQUIRED INFORMATION.
29	The listing must include:

1	(i) the name (including trade name) and address of the facility;
2	(ii) the effective date and term of the suspension, revocation, or nonrenewal; and
3	(iii) the reasons for the suspension, revocation, or nonrenewal.
4	(C) [(b)] Suspensions, revocations, and nonrenewals – Timely notice through social media.
5	(1) COMMISSIONER TO PROVIDE NOTICE.
6 7 8	Promptly after a food service facility has had its license suspended, revoked, or denied renewal, the Commissioner must provide, through 2 or more social media outlets, public notice of the suspension, revocation, or nonrenewal.
9	(2) REQUIRED INFORMATION.
10 11	The notice must include the same information as that required by subsection $[(c)(2)]$ (B)(2) of this section for a website listing.
12	Subtitle 8. Penalties
13	§ 6-801. Enforcement by citation.
14	(a) In general.
15 16 17	In addition to any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement procedure, this title may be enforced by issuance of an environmental citation as authorized by City Code Article 1, Subtitle 40 {"Environmental Control Board"}.
18	(b) Process not exclusive.
19 20	The issuance of an environmental citation to enforce this title does not preclude pursuing any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement action authorized by law.
