## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

1 2	City Streets — Closing — A 10-Foot Alley Extending from the North Side of Esther Place
3	FOR the purpose of condemning and closing a 10-foot alley extending from the north side of
4	Esther Place 170 feet, more or less, to the south side of East Fayette Street, as shown on Plat
5	276-A-25A in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special
6	effective date.

15	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
16	Department of Transportation shall proceed to condemn and close a 10-foot alley extending from
17	the north side of Esther Place 170 feet, more or less, to the south side of East Fayette Street, and
18	more particularly described as follows:
19	Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at a point formed by the intersection of the south side
20	of East Fayette Street 70 feet wide, and the west side of a 10-foot alley, the point
21	of beginning being distant Easterly 68 feet, more or less, measured along the south
22	side of East Fayette Street from the point formed by the intersection of the south
23	side of East Fayette Street and the east side of North Clinton Street 60 feet wide;
24	thence binding on the south side of East Fayette Street, Easterly 10.0, more or
25	less, to intersect the east side of the 10-foot alley; thence binding on the east side
26	of the 10-foot alley, Southerly 170.3 feet, more or less, to intersect the north side
27	of Esther Place 60 feet wide; thence binding on the north side of Esther Place,
28	Westerly 10.0, more or less, to intersect the west side of the 10-foot alley; and

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1 2	thence binding on the west side of the 10-foot alley Northerly 170.3 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning.
3	Containing 1,703 square feet or 0.039 acres of land, more or less.
4 5	As delineated on Plat 276-A-25A, prepared by the Survey Section and filed on March 17, 2017, in the Office of the Department of Transportation.
6 7 8 9 10	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the proceedings for the condemnation and closing of the alley and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Director of Transportation and filed with the Department of Legislative Reference.
11 12 13 14 15 16	<b>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their use has been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or interfere with them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council and, in the application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every kind, arising out of the removal, alteration, or interference.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That no building or structure of any kind (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of Transportation of Baltimore City.
25 26 27 28	<b>SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.
29 30 31 32 33 34	<b>SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That at all times after the closing under this Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from or pay compensation to the owner of the property.
