As a Councilmember, he was a member of the Planning Commission, and as a State Senator, he was a member of many high-profile task forces.

The Law Department approved 17-0165 for form and legal sufficiency, "assuming the property will be controlled by one of the agencies to whom the bill was referred for comment." Also, the Planning Commission provided a favorable report, noting Mr. Irby's many accomplishments. The Department of Real Estate defers to the City Council and has no objections to the Bill. Similarly, the Department of Recreation and Parks has no objections to 17-0165.

SITE/GENERAL AREA

<u>Site Conditions</u>: Madison Square Park is a 4 acre public park in East Baltimore. The park is the south of the Madison Square Recreational Center. The park is surrounded by two neighborhoods Johnston Square and Middle East.

General Area: This property is in the western portion of a predominantly residential area known as Gay Street. It is comprised of public housing and three story row homes.

HISTORY

There are no previous Planning Commission actions regarding this site.

ANALYSIS

Nathan C. Irby Jr. started his career in public service as the chairman of a community planning committee that pushed for the construction of Dunbar High School. He was also active in the Madison Square Housing Corporation.
