





SUBTITLE 20 BALTIMORE CITY COMMISSION FOR WOMEN

§ 20-1. Commission established.

(a) In general.

There is a Baltimore City Commission for Women.

(b) Composition.

The Commission comprises 19 members, to be appointed by the Mayor in accordance with Article IV, § 6 of the City Charter.

(c) Appointment without regard to political affiliation.

The appointment of members must be made without regard to political affiliation. (City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §183(a).) (Ord. 83-955; Ord. 06-359.)

§ 20-2. Terms, compensation, vacancies.

- (a) Terms of office.
 - (1) Members serve for a term of 4 years, concurrent with the terms of the Mayor and the City Council.
 - (2) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (b) Compensation; expenses.

The members of the Commission:

- (1) serve without compensation; but
- (2) are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as provided in the Ordinance of Estimates.
- (c) Vacancies.

A member appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term or to succeed a member who is holding over serves only for the remainder of that term.

(City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §183(b), (c).) (Ord. 83-955; Ord. 99-526; Ord. 06-359; Ord. 16-503.)

§ 20-3. Officers; committees.

- (b) Rules of procedure.

The Commission may adopt rules of procedure to govern its meetings and procedures.

(c) Failure to attend meetings.

If any member is absent from regularly scheduled meetings more than 3 times in 1 year, not counting absences excused by the Chair:

- (1) the member is considered to have resigned; and
- (2) the Chair shall request that member's appointing authority to fill the resultant vacancy. (City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §183(f) (g).) (Ord. 83-955; Ord. 06-359.)

§ 20-5. Personnel; budget.

- (a) Executive Director.
 - (1) The Commission may appoint a properly qualified person as Executive Director of the Commission.

- (2) The Executive Director is entitled to a salary as provided in the Ordinance of Estimates.
 - (3) The Executive Director shall perform the duties that the Commission prescribes.
 - (b) Staff.
 - (1) The Executive Director may employ a staff as provided in the Ordinance of Estimates.
 - (2) Staff members shall be members of the classified service.
 - (c) Volunteers.

The Commission may engage the services of volunteer workers and consultants, without salary, as it considers necessary from time to time.

(d) Budget.

The Director may expend funds as authorized in the Ordinance of Estimates or in any supplemental appropriations.

(City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §184.) (Ord. 83-955; Ord. 06-359.)

§ 20-6. Powers and duties.

(a) In general.

The Baltimore City Commission for Women shall undertake the activities described in this section.

(b) Referral system.

The Commission shall:

- (1) develop an information and referral system for all services in the City related to women; and
- (2) recommend other services when a need for them is determined.
- (c) Forum for amelioration.

The Commission shall serve as the focus and forum for the identification and amelioration of the unique problems faced by women in our society and on any practice of discrimination or prejudice that exists because of gender.

- (d) Research and education.
 - (1) The Commission shall:

- (i) conduct research, policy analysis, and public information and education programs and activities to assist in addressing the needs of women; and

The Commission shall:

- (1) review and monitor the conditions of women in the workforce in Baltimore City;
- (2) make recommendations promoting equal pay for work of equal value and equitable representation by women in all job levels; and
- (3) direct attention to the problems facing women in the workforce.
- (f) Advise and counsel.

The Commission shall:

- (1) advise and counsel the residents of Baltimore City, the City Council, the Mayor, and the various departments and agencies of the City, state, and federal governments on all matters involving women's lives; and
- (2) recommend programs and legislation it considers necessary and proper to promote and ensure equal rights, equal opportunities, and equal access to services for all persons regardless of gender.
- (g) Evaluate policies and programs.

The Commission shall review and evaluate the impact of existing and proposed policies and programs and legislation affecting women.

(h) Seeking to remove inequalities.

The Commission shall work to remove inequalities due to discrimination or prejudice on the basis of gender in housing, recreation, employment, education, community services, criminal justice, financing, credit, insurance, and related matters.

(i) Monitor board and commissions.

The Commission shall monitor City government so as to ensure the equitable representation of women on all City boards and commissions. (City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §185.) (Ord. 83-955; Ord. 06-359.)

FOR the purpose of reaffirming the City Council's support for the Baltimore Commission For Women and its important work to empower women in Baltimore, and requesting that the Administration assign a professional staffer to support the Commission's efforts.

Recitals

The Baltimore Commission For Women believes in a high quality of life and in the equal rights, opportunities, and access to services for all women. When it was established by ordinance in 2006, it was intended to be a resource for women to assist them in accessing services and assistance to improve their lives and the lives of their families. It was charged with empowering women through education and through coordination of opportunities to ensure that barriers to equal rights and opportunities for women will be reduced, with the eventual goal of eliminating those barriers throughout Baltimore City.

Regrettably, the Commission was not adequately staffed or filled and essentially became defunct for far too long. Recently, the Mayor and the City Council have partnered in an effort to revive the Commission so that its important work for women can receive the attention it deserves.

The needs and voices of women and young girls are so important to our collective future, here in Baltimore City, now more then ever. Women and young girls need access to many mentoring and career building "tool kits." They need support for growth and empowerment including raising the quality of life and lessons learned from experiences. Women lack entry to financial capital and specialized skills that can lead to economic advancement. They need multiple opportunities and the ability to engage in exploration activities such as site visits, job shadowing, internships, and community service. The revived Commission will work towards these goals and objectives.

Current plans call for the Commission to have committees on topics such as inadequate healthcare & health insurance, education, gender equality, poverty, hunger, homelessness, the wage gap, reproductive rights, paid sick and parental leave, human trafficking, elder mistreatment, affordable childcare, addiction, foster care, inadequate representation in board rooms, and political life.

However, in order to be successful in assisting Baltimore's women with this ambitious agenda, the Commission will need the assistance of a professional staffer to augment the volunteer efforts of its members. It is important that an Executive Director or Community




