4	THAT CONTAINS A PUBLIC TOILET OR BATHROOM, BOTH MALE AND FEMALE OCCUPANTS
5	MUST HAVE ACCESS TO AT LEAST ONE SAFE, SANITARY, CONVENIENT, AND DISCREET

7	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
