20	CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND FOR PURPOSES OF ASSISTING EFFORTS THAT REDUCE	
21	INEQUITY BASED ON RACE, GENDER, OR ECONOMIC STATUS IN BALTIMORE.

13	(2) GRANTS OR DONATIONS MADE TO THE FUND; AND
14 15	(3) PROCEEDS FROM FINES, FEES, SURCHARGES, OR OTHER REVENUES DEDICATED TO THE FUND BY ORDINANCE.
16	(C) CONTINUING NATURE OF FUND.
17 18	NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS CHARTER, UNSPENT PORTIONS OF THE FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION:
19	(1) REMAIN IN THE FUND, TO BE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THEIR ORDAINED PURPOSES;
20	(2) DO NOT REVERT TO THE GENERAL REVENUES OF THE CITY; AND
21	(3) THEIR APPROPRIATIONS DO NOT LAPSE.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED , That this proposed amendment to the City Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or rejection, in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form specified by the City Solicitor.
