



<u>INTRODUCTION</u> – RPP Area 24 (Greenway) - Plan Amendment For the purpose of amending the Parking Management Plan for RPP Area 24 to prohibit parking without an area 24 permit or visitor pass from 7:00 a.m. through 12 midnight, Monday through Saturday; correcting related language; and setting a special effective date.

<u>PURPOSE/PLANS</u> — As is the case in any large city, the excessive demand for a very limited supply of on-street parking spaces represents a huge and often times extremely frustrating challenge for both the residents and visitors to the City of Baltimore.

To be eligible for a permit the applicant must reside within the boundaries of that particular RPP area. You must show required proof of residency to the satisfaction of the RPP section. Participation in the program is limited to residents only. The permit increases the chances of finding a parking space by stimulating turnover and eliminating storage of non-resident vehicles. A permit does not excuse the observance of any other traffic regulation except the posted RPP time restrictions.

As it pertains to Residential Parking Area 24 – Greenway, there will be a two hour parking limit between the hours of 7:00am and 12 midnight, Monday through Saturday, except with an Area 24 permit or visitor pass.

<u>AGENCY/DEPARTMENT POSITION</u> – The Department of Transportation defers to Parking Authority on City Council Bill 18-0231.





I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 18-0231, introduced by Councilmember Clarke.

The purpose of this bill is amending the Parking Management Plan for RPP Area 24 to prohibit parking without an Area 24 permit or visitor pass from 7:00 a.m. through 12 midnight, Monday through Saturday; correcting related language; and setting a special effective date.


The amendment addresses parking on the 3500 block of N. Charles Street, which currently has a two-hour parking limit from 7:00 a.m. to 12 midnight, Monday through Saturday, except with Area 24 permit or visitor pass. The amendment changes this parking limit for non-permit holders from two hours to zero hours (no parking without permit).

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC) encourages the bill's sponsors to do thorough outreach and engagement of the neighboring residents and community associations regarding the proposed change to RPP Area 24, to allow for their input and learn of any community impacts.

PABC also requests the deletion of, "OR VISITOR PASS," in line #4 and line #25. This language is unnecessary and confusing. The existing language of "Area 24 Permit" is sufficient because it includes all parking permit types offered to residents.

Provided any concerns are addressed through the outreach efforts, and the above requested deletion is adopted, the Parking Authority of Baltimore City does not oppose the passage of City Council Bill 18-0231.

- 7. Councilman Pinkett asked about permit costs; certain changes to an RPP plan; repeal of RPP plans; and sunset language.
- 8. Councilman Stokes made general comments about the need to have some form of parking for community residents.
- 9. Mr. MacMillan testified about the need for parking in the Greenway area.
- 10. Ms. Ackley testified about parking conditions in the neighborhood and the desire to have some form of parking.
- 11. The committee voted to amend the bill according to PABC's proposed amendment in its written report. The hearing was adjourned.

Background

Management Plan Restatement for Residential Permit Parking Area 24 – Greenway (see attachment). Section II of the Plan sets certain parking hour restrictions. Currently, there is a two hour parking limit in Area #24 for non-permit holders from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight, Monday through Saturday. Under Bill 18-0231, the two hour parking limit for non-permit holders would be eliminated. Bill 18-0231 would prohibit non-permit holders from parking in RPP - Area #24 from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday. Only those displaying an Area #24 parking permit or visitor pass would be allowed to park in Area #24 between 7:00 a.m. – 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday.

Baltimore City's Residential Parking Permit Program (RPP) was created in 1979 in an effort to address the specific needs of residents in city neighborhoods where the demand for on-street parking was considered to be greatest. Participating neighborhoods elect to do so through application by petition to the City of Baltimore through the Parking Authority of Baltimore City.

The RPP Program has 46 designated RPP areas, each designated with its own specific number or letter. Parking in each of these 46 areas is restricted to some degree to provide preferential parking privileges only to those residents and their guests who display valid Residential Parking Permits and Visitors Passes on their automobiles. These permits and passes are issued and valid for a one-year period from the designated annual renewal date for each specific RPP Area. Residents must re-apply every year.

In the RPP – Area #24 all residential dwelling units are eligible for up to 4 residential parking permits and 1 Visitor Pass. The RPP Area – 24 Greenway exists for the following block faces:

- 3400 block of North Charles Street, odd side
- 3503 North Charles Street, odd side, odd side posted
- 3507 North Charles Street, odd side, odd side posted
- 3401 Greenway, both sides, both sides posted

- 3405 Greenway, both sides, both sides posted
- 3409 Greenway, both sides, both sides posted

RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING PROGRAM PARKING MANAGEMENT PLAN RESTATEMENT RPP AREA 24-GREENWAY

Pursuant to City Ordinance 12-102 and Article 31, Subtitle 10 of Baltimore City Code, the Parking Authority of Baltimore City is hereby restating the Parking Management Plan for Residential Permit Parking Program Area 24-Greenway (hereinafter "Area 24") that was originally created in September 1978 by administrative order No. 1103. This restatement of the Parking Management Plan for Area 24 replaces the prior administrative regulation and any prior amendments to the Parking Management Plan for Area 24. Any future amendments to the Parking Management Plan will be included herewith.

I. A Residential Permit Parking Program Area known as Area 24, governed by Article 31, Subtitle 10, of the Baltimore City Code, exists for the block faces of the streets listed below:

3400 block of North Charles Street, odd side -3503 North Charles Street, odd side, odd side posted 3507 North Charles Street, odd side, odd side posted 3401 Greenway, both sides, both sides posted 3405 Greenway, both sides, both sides posted 3409 Greenway, both sides, both sides posted

II. The parking restrictions that will be posted and enforced in Area 24 is:

Two Hour Parking Limit, 7:00am – 12 midnight, Monday through Saturday, Except with Area #24 Permit

 - a. Permit Limits/Exceptions:
 - i. All residential dwelling units in Area 24 are eligible for up to 4 residential parking permits and 1 Visitor Passes.

The Church Property at the SE corner of N Charles and E University Parkway
is posted with RPP Area 24 Signs. At the time of this restatement this
property is owned by Johns Hopkins University. This building is not eligible
for permits.


