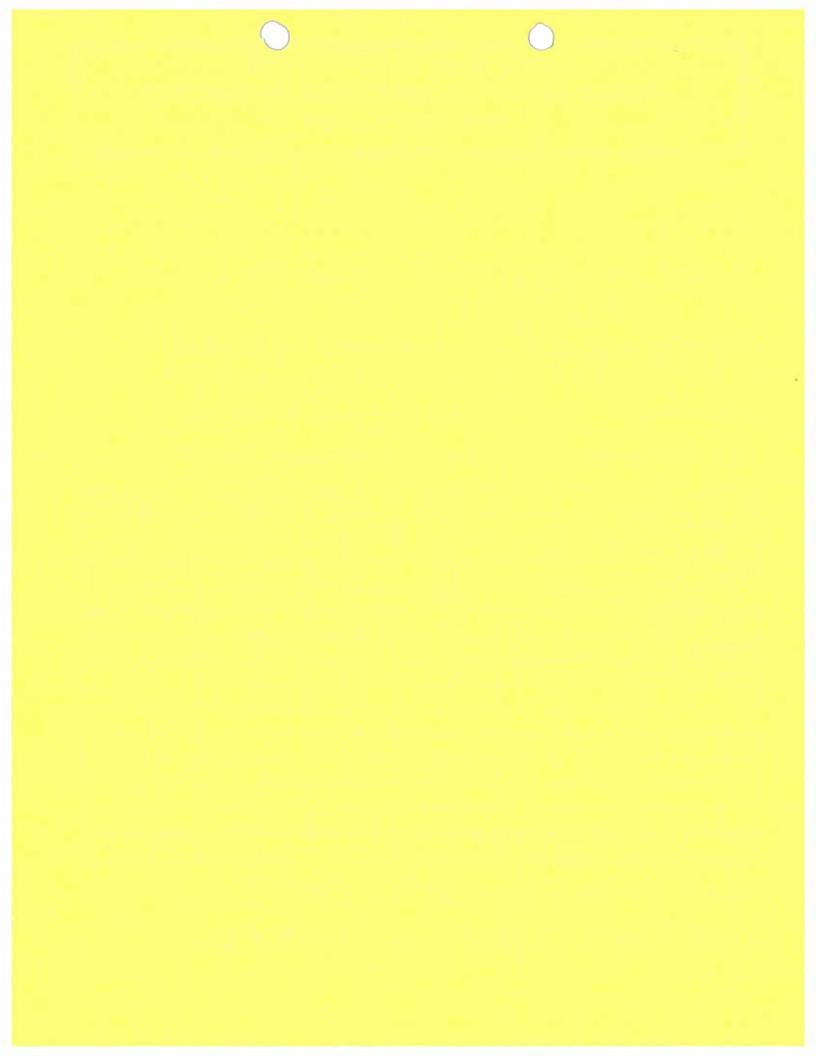

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0235 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill provides a Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$239,511 to the Baltimore City Health Department. The bill shall take effect on the date that it is enacted.

The City Charter establishes the criteria for making supplementary appropriations. City Charter, Art. VI, §8. Section 8(b) of Article VI of the City Charter permits such a supplementary appropriation to be made available to the appropriate municipal agency when funds become available from private or public sources that could not be expected with reasonable certainty at the time of the formulation of the proposed Ordinance of Estimates. The supplementary appropriation must be recommended by the Board of Estimates and must be approved by the Mayor and City Council via an ordinance, which may only encompass a "single program, purpose, activity or project." See Sec. 8(c). The bill provides that the source of revenue is a grant from the Maryland Department of Health to provide funding to facilitate the integration of Ryan White Services within the City.

The Law Department approves this bill for form and legal sufficiency.

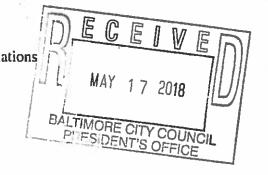

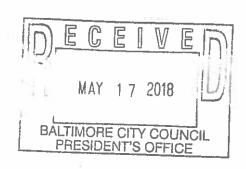
The Baltimore City Health Department (BCHD) is pleased to have the opportunity to review #18-0235 – Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation - Health Department - \$239,511. The purpose of this legislation is to provide funding to facilitate the integration of Ryan White Services within the City.

Ryan White has been integral in reducing the instances of HIV/AIDS transmission and related deaths. The Ryan White Part A Program and Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) provided care to 12,486 people living with HIV/AIDS in 2017. In Fiscal Year 2017, the Greater Baltimore HIV Health Services Planning Council allocated Ryan White Part A and MAI funds to eight of the 13 Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) - approved core medical services, as well as eight of the 16 HRSA support services offered, all of which have the potential to improve clinical outcomes.

Primary medical care is available in multiple sites in Ryan White's Eligible Metropolitan Areas (EMA), including Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), small independent private settings, and hospital-based settings. Regardless of setting, many programs use evidence-based medicine models and show good outcomes, as demonstrated by our EMA's viral suppression rate of 87%. Many of the larger EMA programs provide comprehensive care using a team of co-located care professionals to address the medical, mental health, and social needs of patients. All Ryan White primary medical care programs also receive case management funding to address engagement and retention in care.

Since its expansion in 2009, the Ryan White program has proven to be a great tool in combatting HIV/AIDS in Baltimore City. For the forgoing reasons, the Health Department urges a favorable report on Council Bill #18-0235.

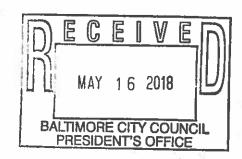

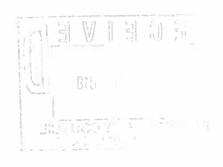

Article VI - Board of Estimates, Section 8 - Ordinance of Estimates - Deficiencies and Supplementary Appropriations of the Baltimore City Charter governs the mandates for supplementary appropriations.

§ 8. Deficiencies: Supplementary appropriations.

(b) Supplementary appropriations — when authorized.

Except as provided herein, the Ordinance of Estimates shall include all the moneys to be appropriated by the City for all purposes for the fiscal year for which the ordinance is applicable. Additional appropriations shall be permitted during the fiscal year only in the following circumstances and under the following conditions:

(2) Unanticipated grants.

Grants from private or governmental sources which could not be expected with reasonable certainty at the time of the formulation of the proposed Ordinance of Estimates may be made available to the appropriate municipal agency for expenditure by a supplementary appropriation ordinance recommended to the City Council by the Board of Estimates, duly passed by the City Council by a majority vote of its members and approved by the Mayor.

(c) Supplementary appropriations - Requisites of ordinance.

Every such further or additional appropriation shall be embodied in a separate ordinance limited to a single program, purpose, activity or project therein stated, and each such supplementary appropriation ordinance shall also, anything contained in the Charter to the contrary notwithstanding, provide the revenue necessary to pay the appropriation by a source, other than the full rate property tax, imposed under the authority of Article II. The revenue shall be levied and collected as directed in the ordinance. The estimate of the revenues to be derived from any source proposed in a supplementary appropriation ordinance shall be made by the Board of Estimates.

Background

This is a Grant Award from the Maryland Department of Health. The period of the grant award is July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

This award provides funds to the Baltimore City Health Department, (Service 720- see attached) to facilitate the integration of Ryan White services within the city; activities that work toward meeting the objectives of the Maryland Integrated HIV Plan; to include coordinating better responses to HIV services through program administration and quality management.²

The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program is a federal program focused specifically on providing HIV care and treatment services to people living with HIV. Working with cities, states, and local community-based organizations, the Program provides a comprehensive system of care for people living with HIV who are uninsured or underinsured. A smaller but critical portion of the Program is used to fund technical assistance, clinical training, and the development of innovative models of care.³

Council Bill 18-0235, upon the approval of the City Council and Mayor will complete the process necessary to allocate these funds to the City's Health Department.

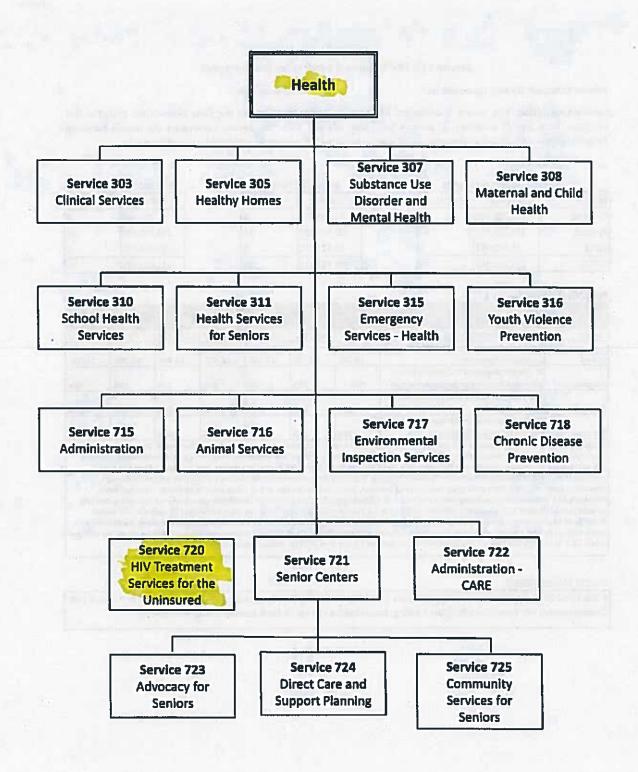

In 2014, the Syringe Exchange Program changed from a 1.1 exchange to a needs-based/negotiated syringe distribution model. This public policy change aims to increase the circulation of sterile syringes among the target population, and further decrease the rate of HiV transmission directly attributed to unsafe injection practices in Baltimore. This has a ignificantly increased the number of syringes in circulation. Addressing opioid overdose is also a core function of the Syringe Exchange Program. Regarding the performance target for the 8 of HiV tests performed through Community Outreach, the Service aims to do more targeted outreach, performing fewer tests to find a new positive and using resources more efficiently. As a result of using more targeted testing based on epidemiologic data, the Service has launched a new strategy of connecting that data through spatial analysis and mapping of new HiV cases tied to sex partner meeting places. These places are identified through a Public Health investigator who interviews those newly identified as HiV positive. Per figures released in 2015 by the Centers for Disease Control, the Baltimore metro area ranks 10th among metro areas when comparing new HiV cases, with a rate of 22.1 new dianoses for every 100,000 residents, the national rate is 12.3 There were 618 new HiV cases reported in the Baltimore metro area in 2015, down slightly from 678 a vear earlier.

MAJOR BUDGET ITEMS

 The Fiscal 2018 recommended budget includes an additional \$8.9 million in pass-through federal Ryan White Part B and Comprehensive HIV Prevention Program funding; this reflects a change in fiscal agency versus new funding.

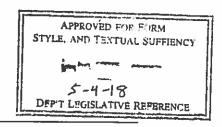

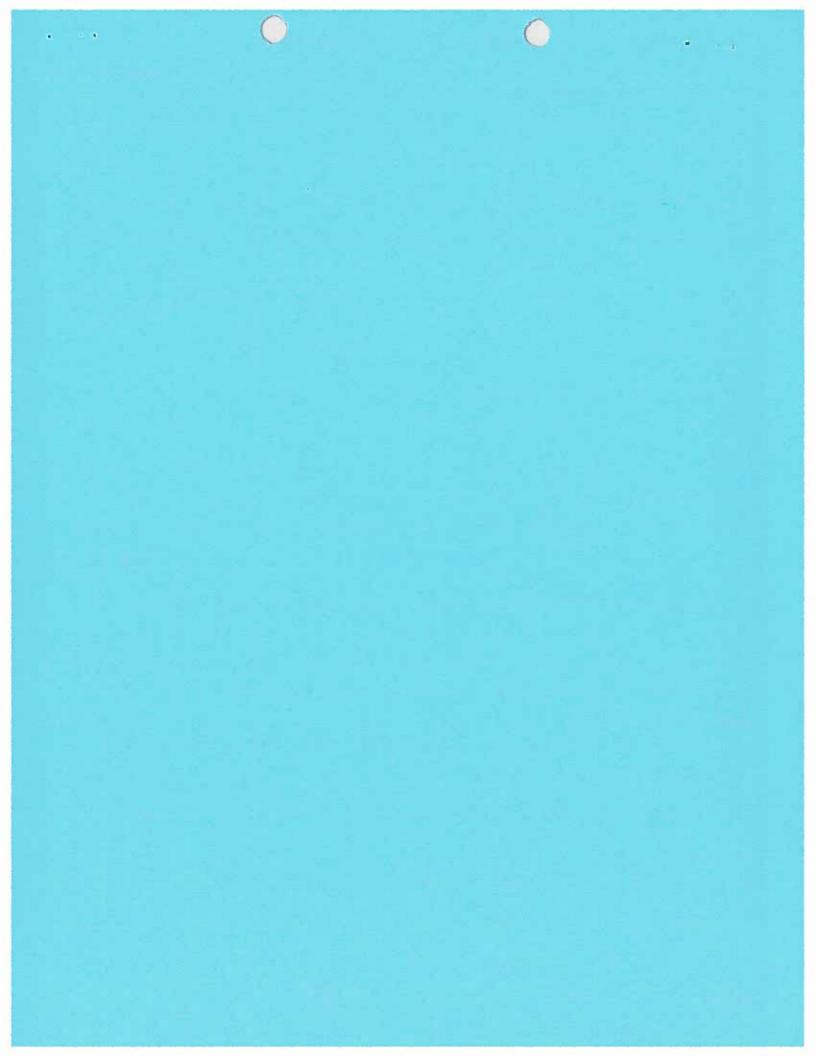
