





This letter is submitted on behalf of Joseph Smith & Sons, one of the oldest and largest scrap processors in the Mid-Atlantic region, located in Capitol Heights, MD. We are writing with regard to Council Bill 17-003, entitled, "Zoning – Nonconforming Junk ... Yards or Vehicle Dismantling Facilities, Recyclable Materials Recovery Facilities", to draw your attention to a number of issues with the impetus for the bill, as well as the bill's implications if passed. It is unsurprising that this bill was introduced at the request of Baltimore Scrap Corporation ("Baltimore Scrap"), as it is our position that the bill is narrowly tailored to substantially benefit their business to the detriment of City residents and businesses. We strongly urge the Land Use & Transportation Committee to consider the concerns outlined below when assessing the merits of Council Bill 17-0031 in the coming weeks.

As drafted, Council Bill 17-0031 has the potential to effectively release Baltimore Scrap from their statutory obligations to protect the environment and Baltimore's waterways. The proposed bill removes current language in the Baltimore City Zoning Code that requires junk yards to, "comply with all federal, state, and local environmental laws, rules and regulations...," through the adoption of legally-compliant pollution prevention plans. While this proposed change has obvious negative implications for the health and safety of Baltimore's residents by eliminating wide-ranging environmental protections, this concern is exacerbated by the fact that the MD Department of the Environment (MDE) is currently reviewing numerous potential violations by Baltimore Scrap resulting from no less than 7 inspections in the past year since MDE discovered discharge of contaminated storm water directly into the City's storm drains. We submit to you that this fact alone should be cause for concern regarding the motivation for the bill.

Furthermore, Council Bill 17-0031 relaxes the requirements for expansion of a nonconforming junk or scrap yard in the City to the benefit of Baltimore Scrap. In 2012, the Baltimore City Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals approved an expansion of Baltimore Scrap's conditional use as a junk yard on the condition that Baltimore Scrap install a 6 foot opaque fence with perimeter landscaping bordering the area of expansion. Despite the fact that this condition was never met, the proposed bill would allow Baltimore Scrap to again expand, potentially to non-contiguous properties within an arbitrary 3,000 feet from their property.

Finally, Council Bill 17-0031 seeks to limit competition of recycling facilities in the City by preventing operators of a recyclable materials recovery facility from purchasing materials on-site from the public. This anomalous provision amending Section 14-333 of the Zoning Code should draw the Committee's concern when coming at the request of one particular scrap metal yard. We submit to you that this proposed change is nothing more than an attempt to benefit a particular business model to the disadvantage of other businesses in the scrap metal industry.

We are keenly aware of your Committee's dedication to being business-friendly while adopting prudent measures to preserve the health and safety of Baltimore's citizens- we appreciate your efforts in this regard. We do believe, however, that passage of Council Bill 17-0031 would be contrary to both the interests of City residents *and* businesses for the reasons set forth above.

Again, we respectfully request your deliberation of these points when considering potential passage of Council Bill 17-0031.




