Re: City Council Bill 18-0110R- Investigative Hearing - Residency Requirements for City Officials

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0110R for form and legal sufficiency. This resolution is for the purpose of calling for a hearing to measure the compliance of City Officials with residency and voting registration requirements, and to determine how to move forward so that 100% compliance is reached.

In general, a City Council resolution is "an expression of opinion or mind concerning some particular item of business coming within the legislative body's official cognizance." Inlet Assocs. v. Assateague House Condominium Assoc., 545 A.2d 1296, 1303 (Md. 1988) (quoting McQuillin Mun. Corp. § 15:2 (3rd Ed.)). Council Bill 18-0110R is an appropriate resolution to express the Council's concerns about this particular situation and request that appropriate officials to discuss implementation efforts.

The Law Department approves Council Bill 18-0110R for form and legal sufficiency as it is a valid method of conveying City Council's desires regarding this matter.
