The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0281 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would allow the City to condemn and close a portion of South Washington Street, extending from Aliceanna Street southerly 90 feet to the southernmost extremity of it, as shown on Plat 344-A-60A in the office of the Department of Transportation. The bill expressly reserves the rights the Mayor and City Council have in the structures located under the street bed, including access rights.

Section (34) of Article II of the City Charter grants the Mayor and City Council the power to "construct, open, extend, widen, straighten or close streets, bridges, tunnels or approaches to them and other public ways of every kind within the bounds of the City." Section 116(b)(2) of Article VII of the City Charter requires the Department of Transportation to prepare all ordinances for the opening and closing of streets.

As this bill meets with the applicable sections of the Charter, the Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency.





City Streets - Closing A Portion of South Washington Street

FOR the purpose of condemning and closing a portion of South Washington Street, extending from Aliceanna Street southerly 90 feet to the southernmost extremity of it, as shown on Plat 344-A-60A in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Department of Transportation shall proceed to condemn and close a portion of South Washington Street, extending from Aliceanna Street southerly 90 feet to the southernmost extremity of it, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the west side of South Washington Street 70 feet wide, and the south side of Aliceanna Street 70 feet wide, the point of beginning being distant Easterly 300.0 feet, more or less, measured along the south side of Aliceanna Street from the point formed by the intersection of the south side of Aliceanna Street and the east side of South Wolfe Street 60 feet wide; thence crossing South Washington Street Easterly 70.0 feet to intersect the east side of South Washington Street; thence departing from the south side of Aliceanna Street and binding on the east side of South Washington Street Southerly 90.0 feet, more or less, to the southernmost extremity of it; thence binding on the southernmost extremity of South Washington Street Westerly 70.0 feet to the west side of South Washington Street in Street; thence binding on the west side of South Washington Street Northerly 90.0 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning.



AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no building or structure of any kind (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of Transportation of Baltimore City.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at all times after the closing under this Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from or pay compensation to the owner of the property.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
