SITE/GENERAL AREA

General Area:

The Wyman Park Medical Center Joint Use Facility with The Johns Hopkins University Planned Unit Development (PUD), also known as the Wyman Park Medical Center PUD, is located in the Remington neighborhood. John Hopkins University Homewood campus is north of the site and residential properties are adjacent to the site to the south. The PUD was established under the previous zoning code, and included properties zoned R-9, OR, and B-2. Under the current zoning regulations, all of the properties within the PUD are zoned Educational Campus (EC)-2.

Site Conditions:

The Wyman Park Medical Center PUD is an 8.01-acre site bounded by Remington Avenue, West 31st Street, and Wyman Park Road. When the PUD was established, the site was improved with ten separate buildings, surface parking, and landscape. Today, only four of those buildings remain – the main hospital, the Chiller Plant, the Boiler Plant, and a two-story building along Remington Avenue. A 300-space surface parking lot is located where the other buildings once stood, which was authorized by a minor amendment to the PUD in October of 1999.

No area of the PUD lies within a Master Plan area, Urban Renewal Plan area, designated historic district, Chesapeake Bay Critical Area, or regulated floodplain.

HISTORY

- Ordinance #87-1171, approved December 7, 1987, established the Planned Unit Development.
- Minor Amendment for the surface parking lot approved by Planning Commission on October 21, 1999.

ANALYSIS

The Wyman Park Medical Center PUD was created to provide supportive office and retail space for the hospital and to accommodate the expansion of the Johns Hopkins University Homewood campus. Convenient, on-site parking was also needed for hospital guests and to eliminate spillover parking in the surrounding neighborhood. The original development plan proposed the demolition of several residential structures on site and construction of an eight-story office building, a pedestrian bridge, a five-story parking garage for 1,100 vehicles, and a new structure to replace Building No. 2. Landscape improvements were also planned to buffer the campus from the residential community and provide outdoor therapeutic areas for patients. The majority of this development was scheduled for completion in 1990. However, the construction of the new buildings never commenced. In 1999, the PUD was amended to permit the construction of an interim surface parking lot, which remains today.

With a new vision for the site and complementary zoning regulations that are suited for uses and density typically found on university campuses, the petitioner has requested to repeal the Wyman Park Medical Center PUD and verified that the underlying zoning meets their present and future needs. Eliminating non-essential land use regulatory layers to promote by-right development has been an overall goal of the Transform Baltimore Comprehensive Rezoning initiative. For this reason, the PUD is no longer needed and should be repealed per the recommendations of CCB #18-0314.



The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 18-0314 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill repeals Ordinance 87-1171, which designated certain properties as a Residential Planned Unit Development known as The Wyman Park Medical Center Joint Use Facility with the Johns Hopkins University Planned Unit Development. The bill has an immediate effective date.

The Law Department notes that upon repeal of a PUD, the uses and structures in the affected area, in some instances, may be considered non-conforming uses. The legal disposition of non-conforming uses and structures are regulated by Title 18 of Article 32. The Article places restrictions on changes in the uses and structures designated as non-conforming. Parties therefore are encouraged to review the Article to determine the legal constraints on property development following the repeal of the PUD.

The Law Department is prepared to approve the bill as drafted.

I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 18-0314 introduced by Council members Clarke and Stokes on behalf of Johns Hopkins University.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Bill is to repeal Ordinance 87-1171 which designated certain property as a Residential Planned Unit Development known as the Wyman Park Medical Center Joint Use Facility with The Johns Hopkins University.

BRIEF HISTORY

The Wyman Park PUD is bounded by Remington Avenue, West 31st Street, and Wyman Park Road. It is approximately 8 acres in size and when established, consisted of a parking area and 10 separate buildings. At the time, the properties were zoned R-9, OR, and B-2. The original development plan involved demolishing several of the existing buildings, to be followed by the construction of a multi-story office building, a parking garage, and a replacement building. While some of the buildings were demolished, construction of the new structures never occurred. In 1999 the Planning Commission approved a minor amendment to permit the construction of a temporary parking lot, which is still in use. Since the PUD and minor amendment were approved, passage of Transform Baltimore (the comprehensive rewriting of the zoning code) changed the underlying zoning of the PUD to Educational Campus-2. City Council Bill 18-0314 would repeal the PUD as the current zoning meets the anticipated needs for this site.



The purpose of this bill is to repeal Ordinance 87-1171, which designated certain property as an industrial Planned Unit Development known as the Wyman Park Medical Center Joint Use Facility with The Johns Hopkins University; and providing for a special effective date. Future development will use the underlying zoning district as prescribed by the Zoning Code (EC-2).

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC) reviewed the proposed legislation. The legislation does not explicitly address parking; however, this site is located adjacent to the Remington neighborhood, where the Parking Authority administers a residential parking permit program. The Remington community created Residential Permit Parking in this area to minimize the parking demand impact generated from the campus of the Johns Hopkins University; as such the community has an acute interest in all parking changes in this neighborhood especially at the Johns Hopkins University.

The Parking Authority does not oppose this legislation, provided that if any waiver or modification of the parking requirements is requested, the requester perform outreach to and engagement with the neighboring residents and community associations to learn of their concerns and if there are community impacts that should be addressed. As building plans and uses for the property become more defined, the Parking Authority will also be involved through Site Plan Review and Planning Commission hearings to ensure that parking demand is adequately addressed.

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City does not oppose the passage of City Council Bill 18-0314 subject to the above noted considerations.



Background

John Hopkins University, the applicant, owns the 8.01-acre site which is located in the Remington neighborhood. Established in 1987 via Ordinance 87-1171, the Wyman Park Medical Center Joint Use Facility with the Johns Hopkins University Planned Unit Development (PUD) is also known as the Wyman Park Medical Center PUD. The site is improved with four buildings, a surface parking lot, and landscape. The facility is situated just south of John Hopkins University's Homewood campus. CC Bill 18-0314, if approved, would repeal Ordinance 87-1171

Bounded by West 1st Street, Wyman Park Road and Remington Avenue, the property is currently zoned Educational Campus (EC-2). Prior to Transform Baltimore, the site included nine separate properties zoned residential R-9, office-residential OR, and business B-2. The area does not lie within an Urban Renewal Plan, historic district, Chesapeake Bay Critical Area or regulated floodplain.

The PUD was originally zoned to provide supportive office and retail space for the hospital and to accommodate the expansion of the John Hopkins University Homewood campus. The PUD's development plan was not fully completed and is no longer under consideration by the owner. The applicant is requesting a repeal of the original development plan and will rely on current zoning to meet its present and future needs for mixed use development.

The property is adjacent to the Remington neighborhood, where the Parking Authority of Baltimore City administers a residential parking permit program. PABC will continue to assess parking demands for the area using Site Plan Review and Planning Commission processes.




