AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Gender-Inclusive Single-User Restrooms

FOR the purpose of requiring that certain single-user restrooms in Baltimore City be made
available to all individuals regardless of gender; requiring that certain single-user restrooms
use gender-inclusive signage to identify the restroom; defining certain terms; establishing
certain penalties; and providing for a special effective date.
