10 11	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE , That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

18 19	A disabled person may be eligible for a reserved parking space if the person meets the following criteria:
20 21	(1) the disability of the applicant must be permanent or of a nature expected to adversely affect the applicant for at least 1 year;
22 23	(2) the applicant must be unable to use public transportation, leaving a personal vehicle as the only means of transportation;

1 2	(3) the applicant must be the sole operator of the vehicle or, if the applicant is dependent upon a non-handicapped driver for transportation, the driver must

6	the applicant's property;] and
7	(5) [(6)] the applicant submits an application in the form that the Director of

9	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
10	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
11	Ordinance.
12	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day
13	after the date it is enacted.
