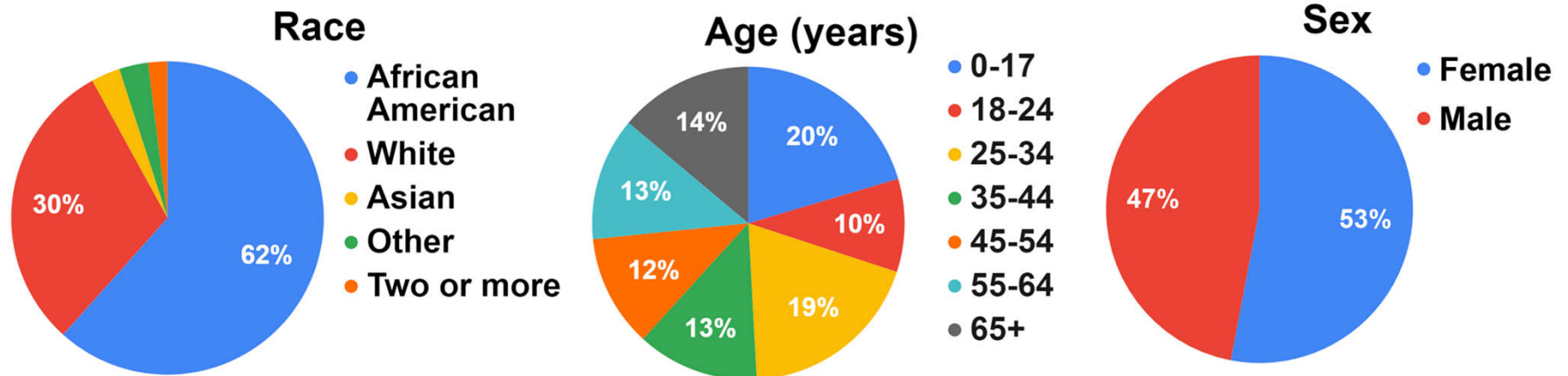

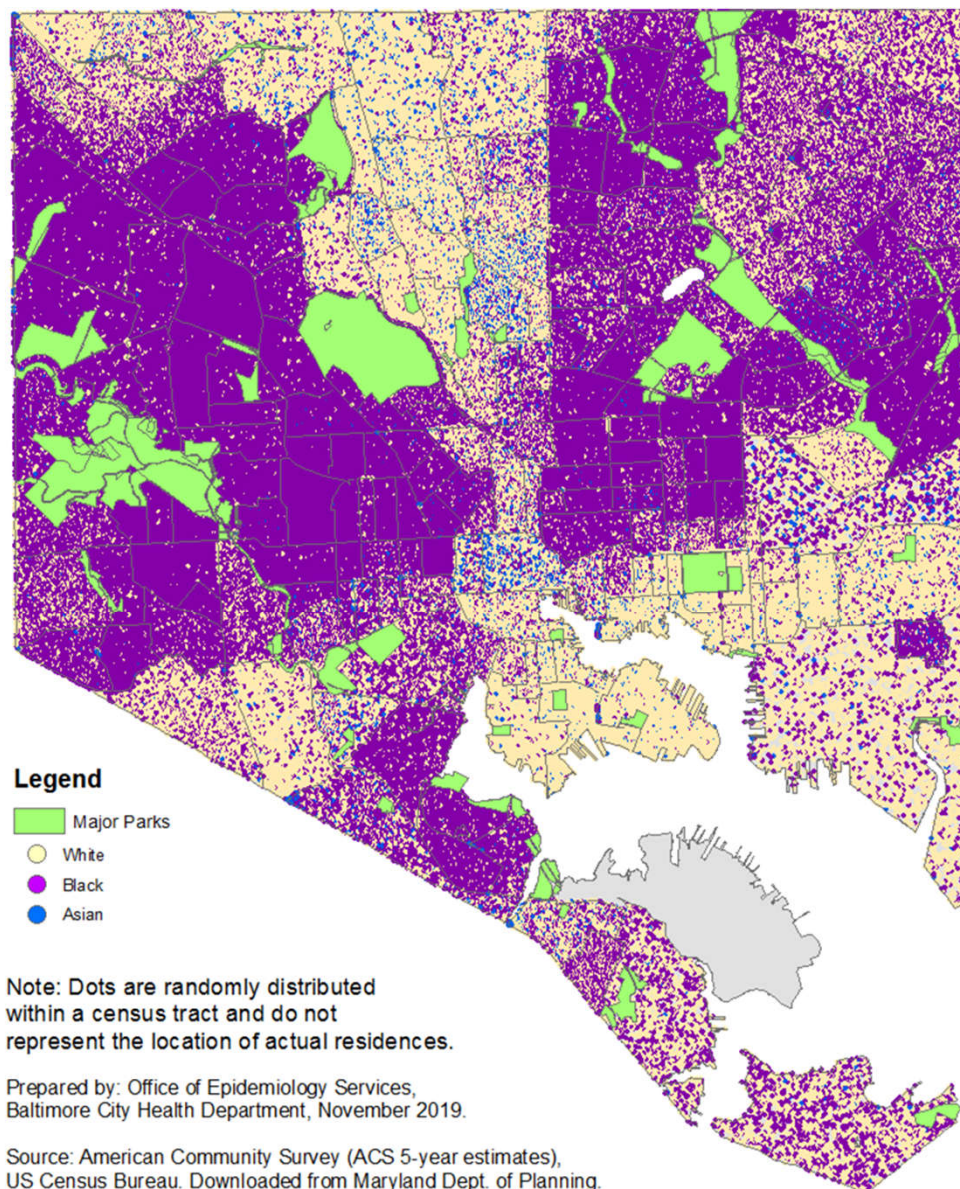

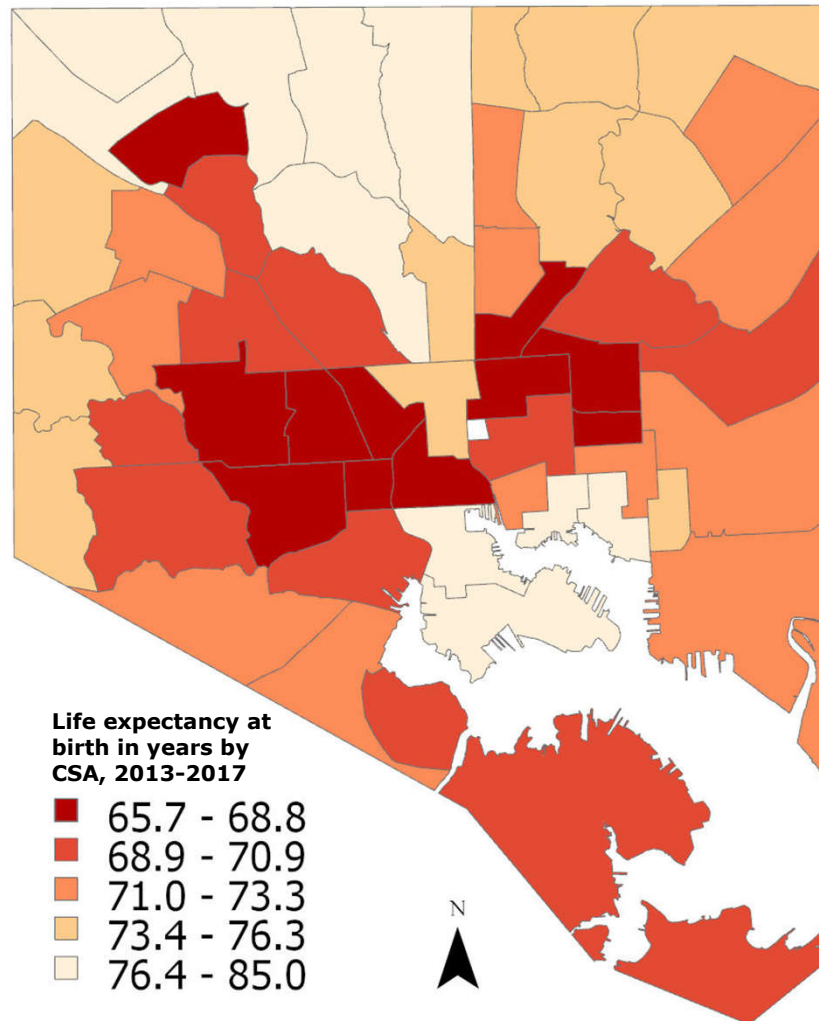

# Life Expectancy

Life expectancy in the wealthiest neighborhoods in Baltimore City is 80+ years old, but the most disadvantaged neighborhoods in Baltimore City have significantly lower life expectancy, the lowest at about 66 years.



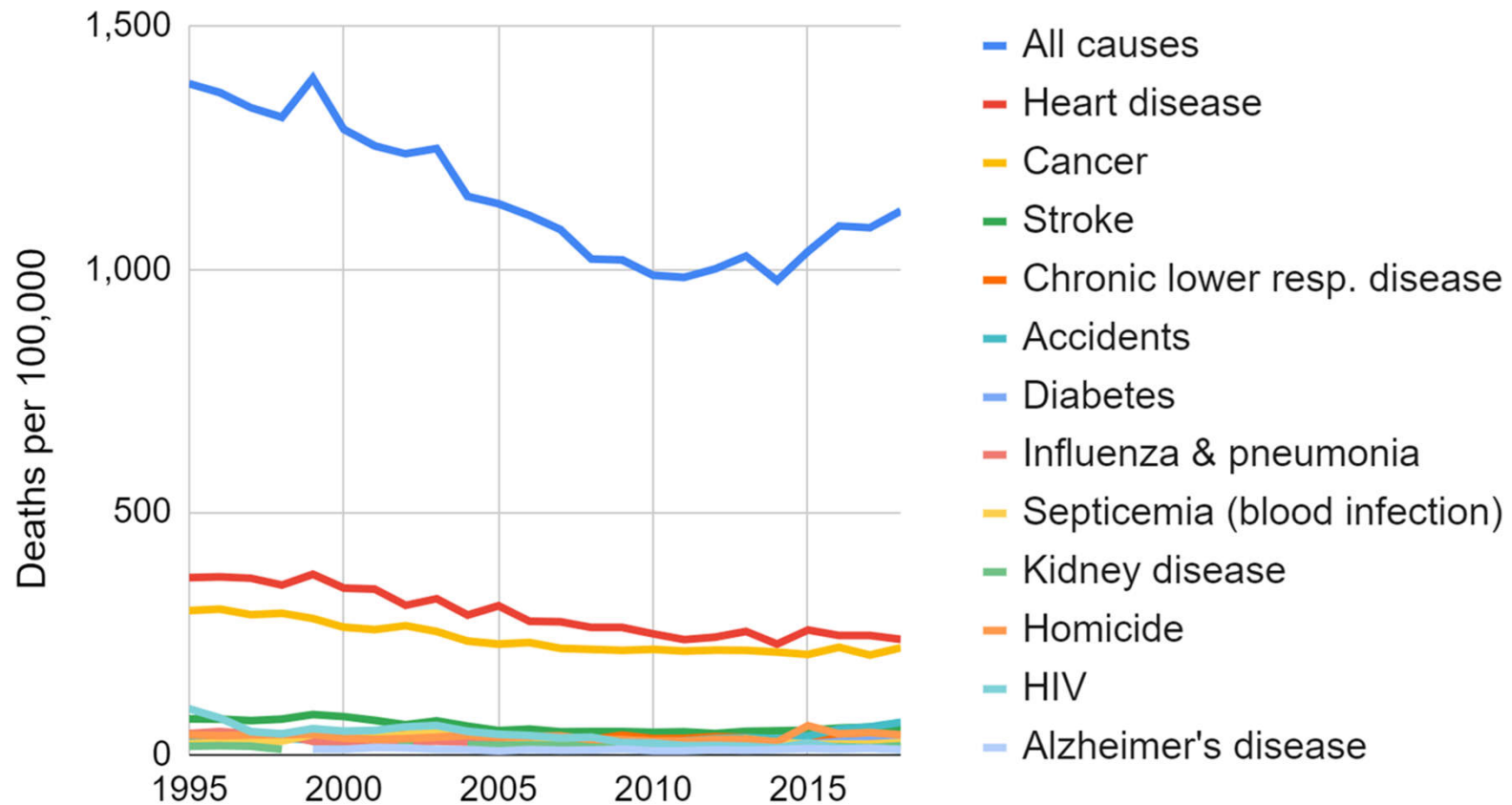

# Crude Mortality Rates by Cause of Death and Year, 1995-2018

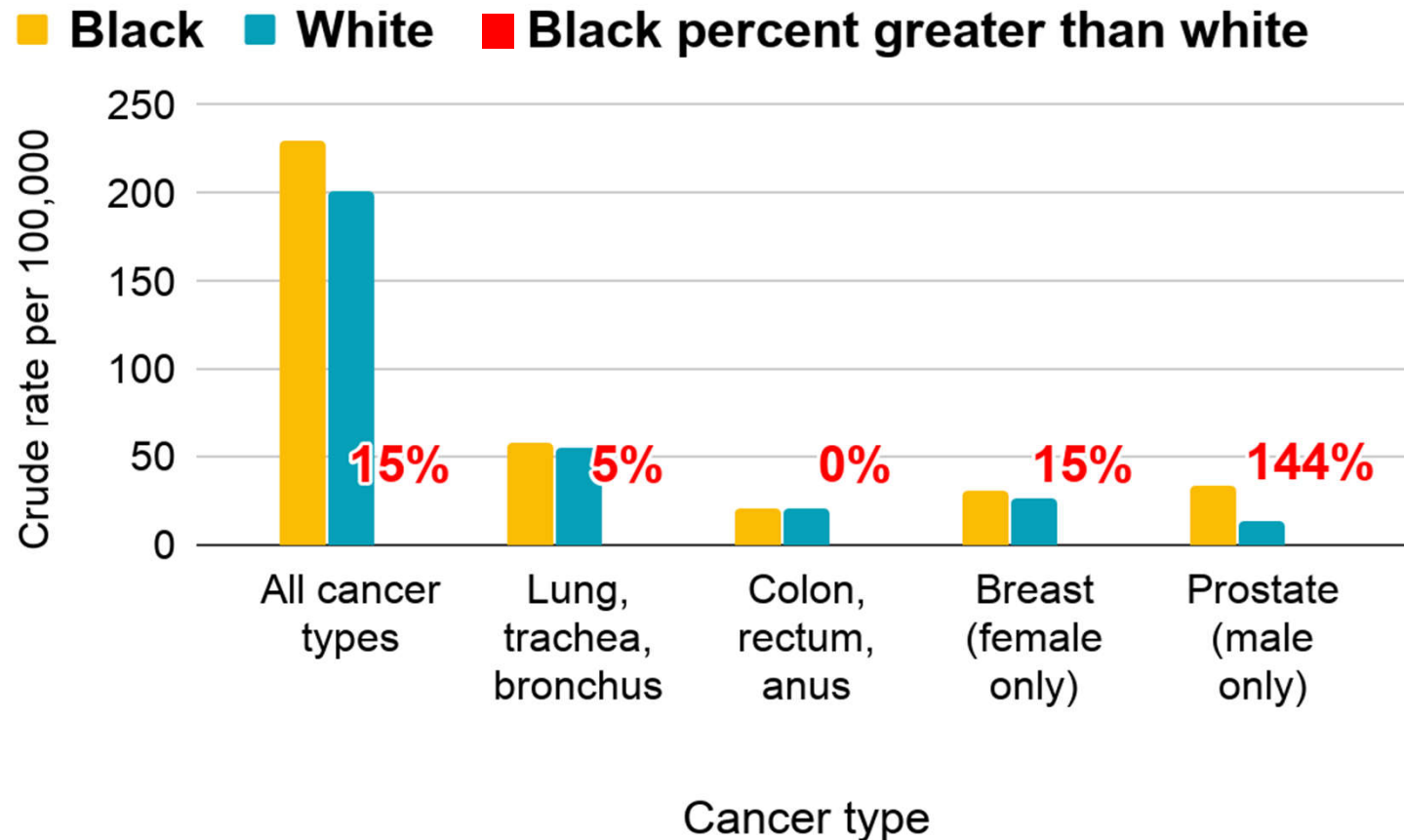

# Disparities in Cancer Mortality, 2016-2017



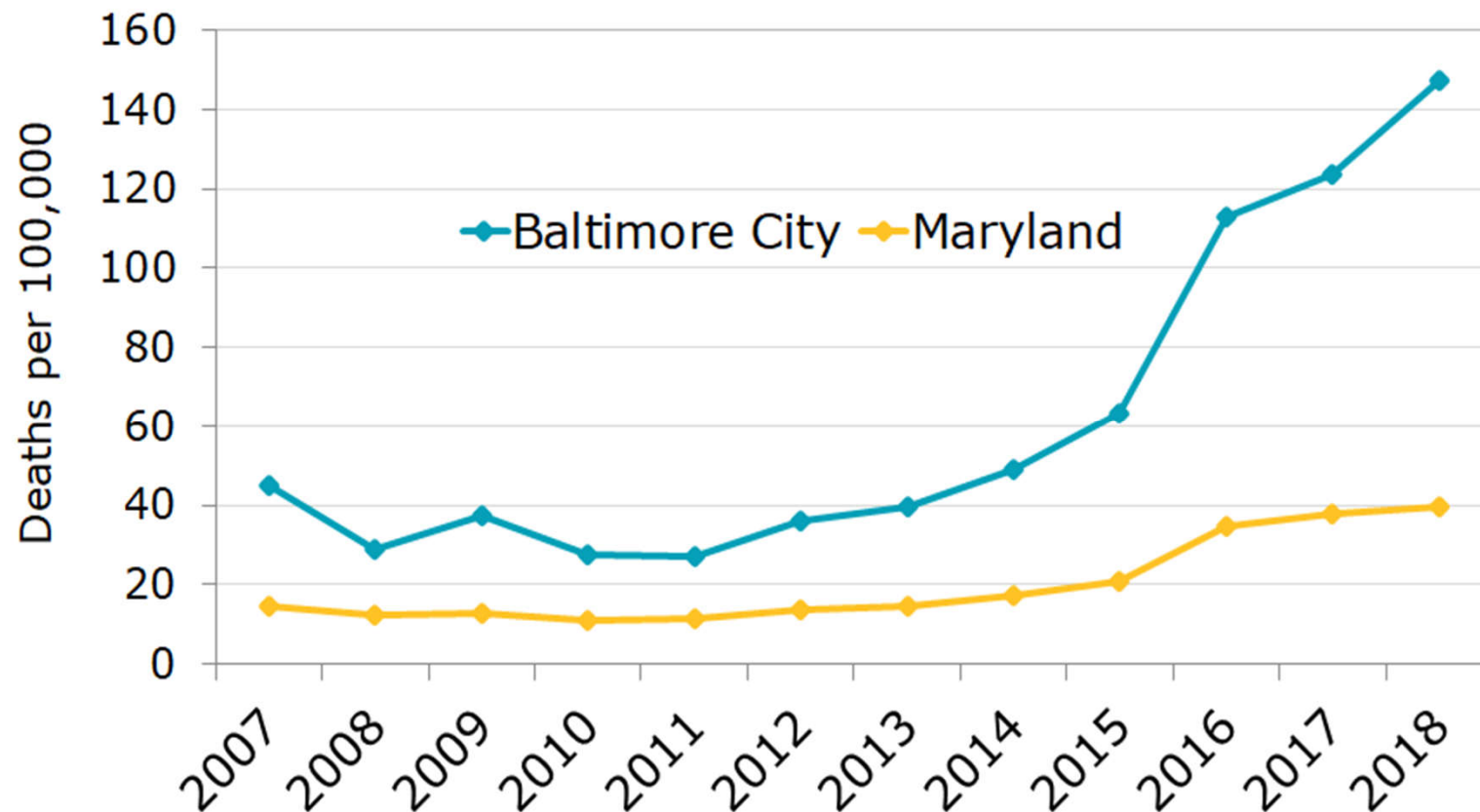

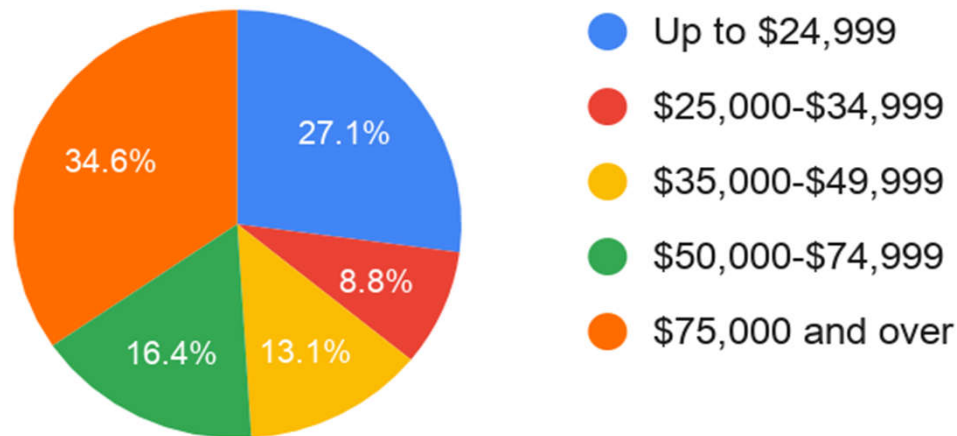

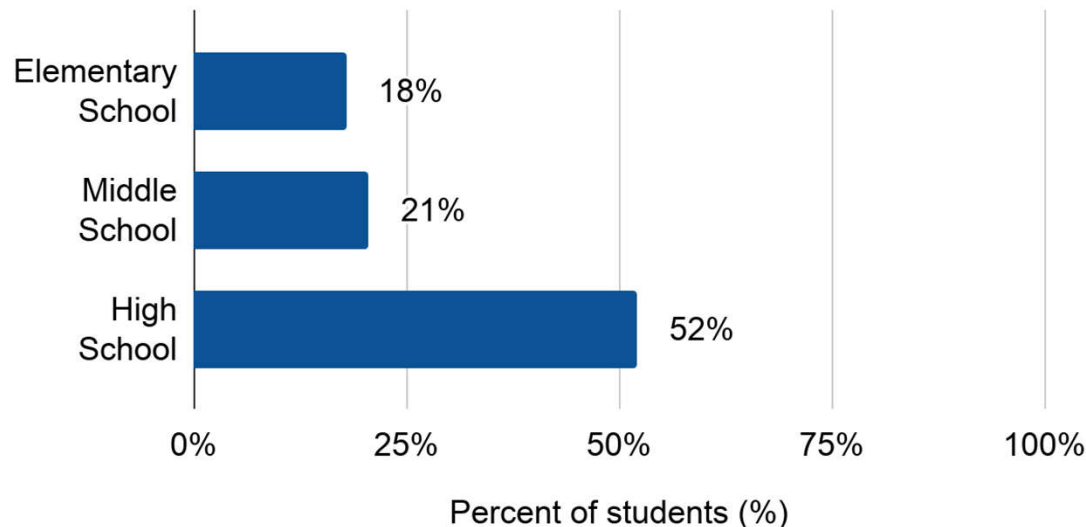

Percent of Students Chronically Absent (Missing at least 20 days) by Grade Level, BCPS, 2016-2017



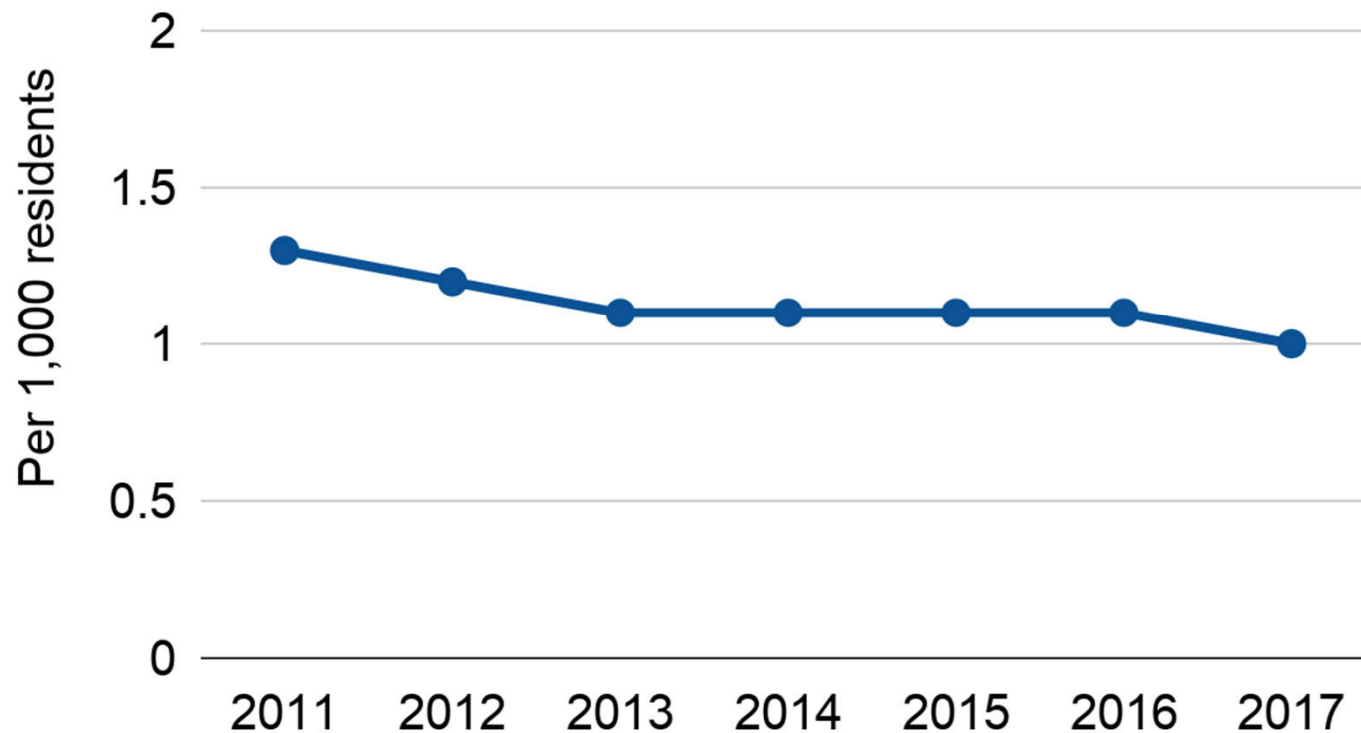

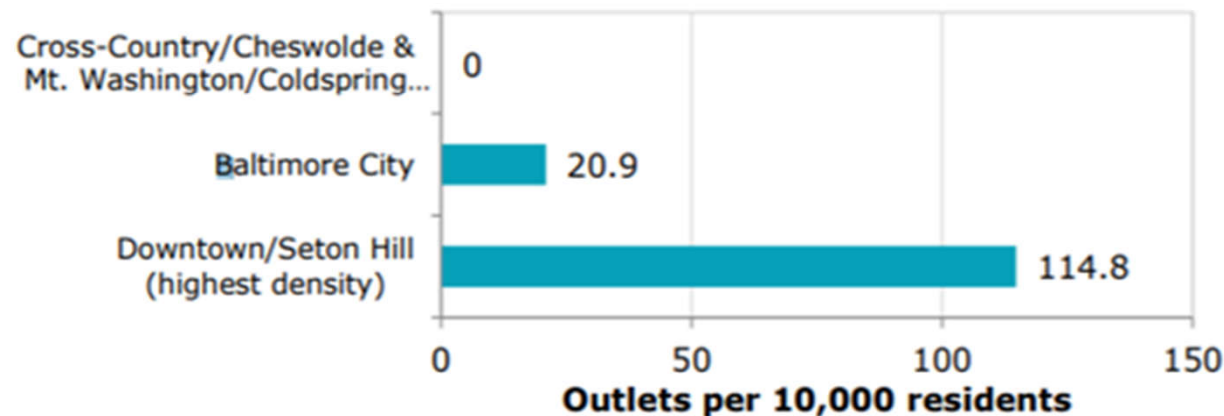

vs. Baltimore City Overall, 2016**



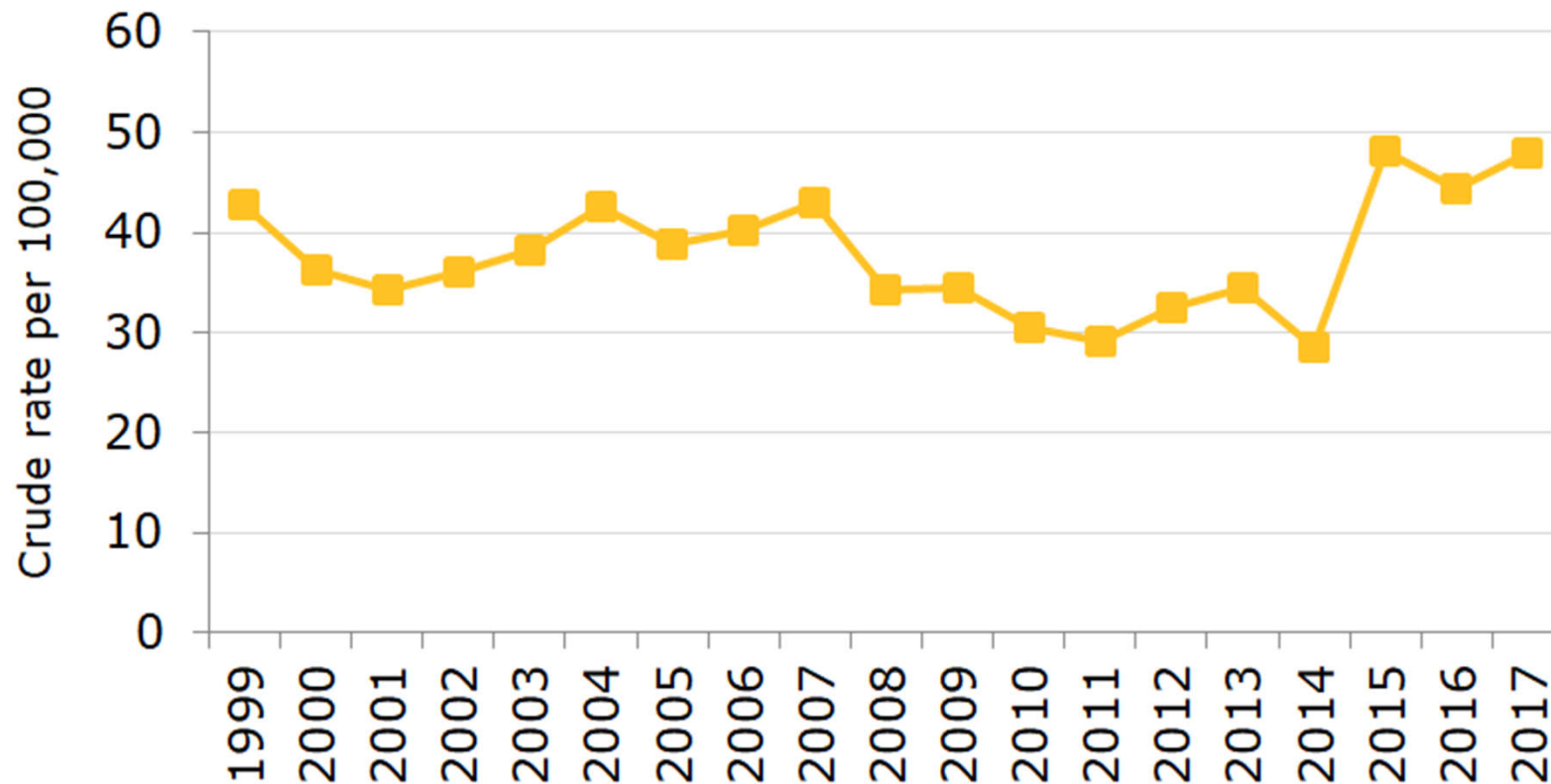

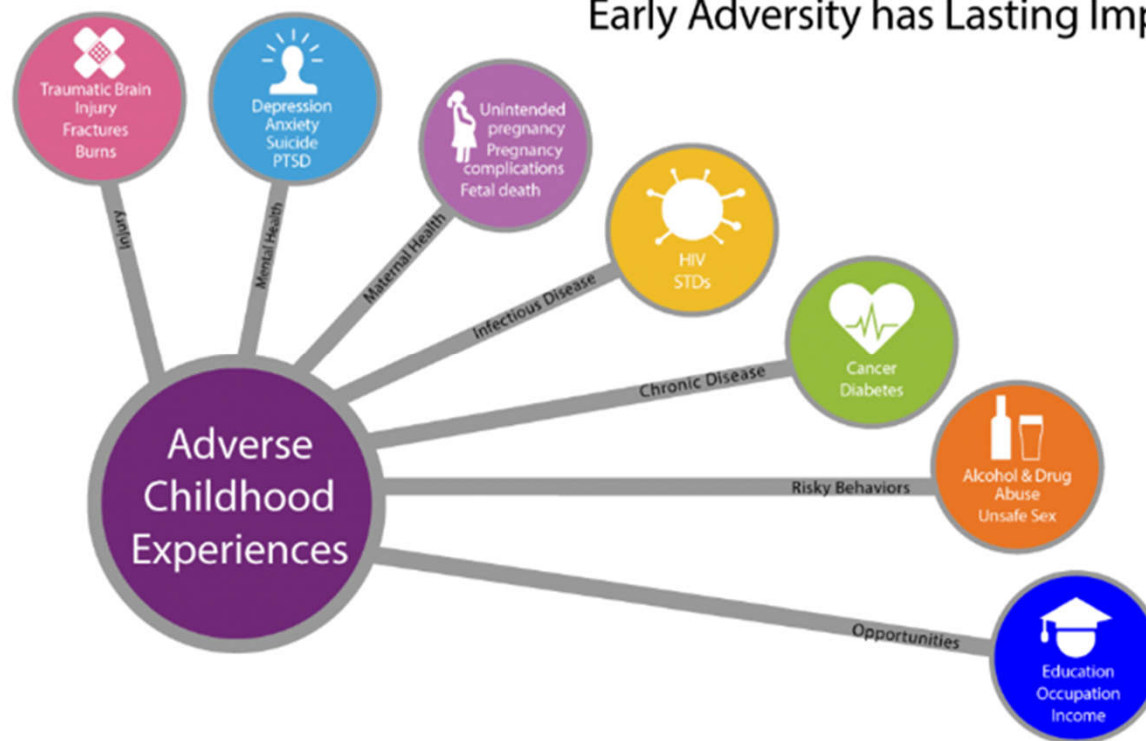

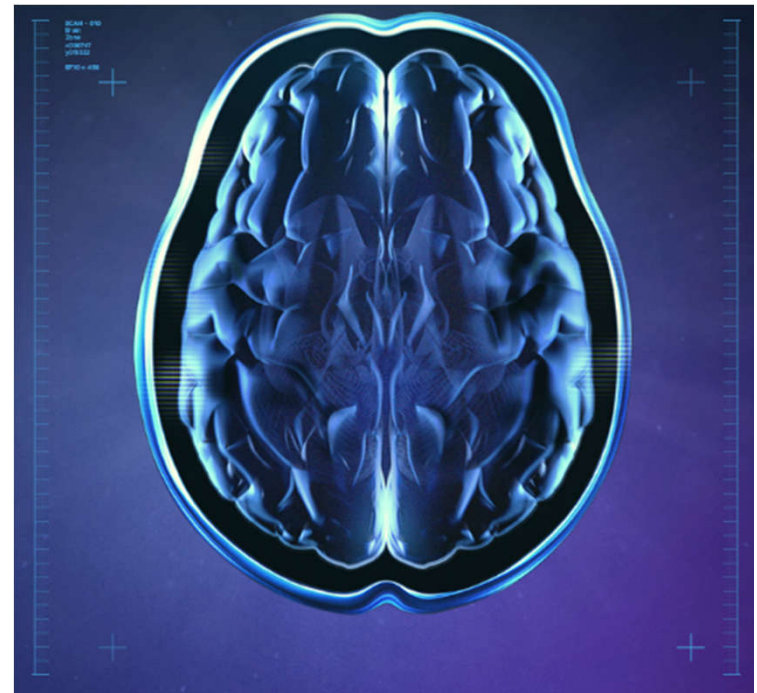

# Trauma Impacts Brain Child Development and Early Death

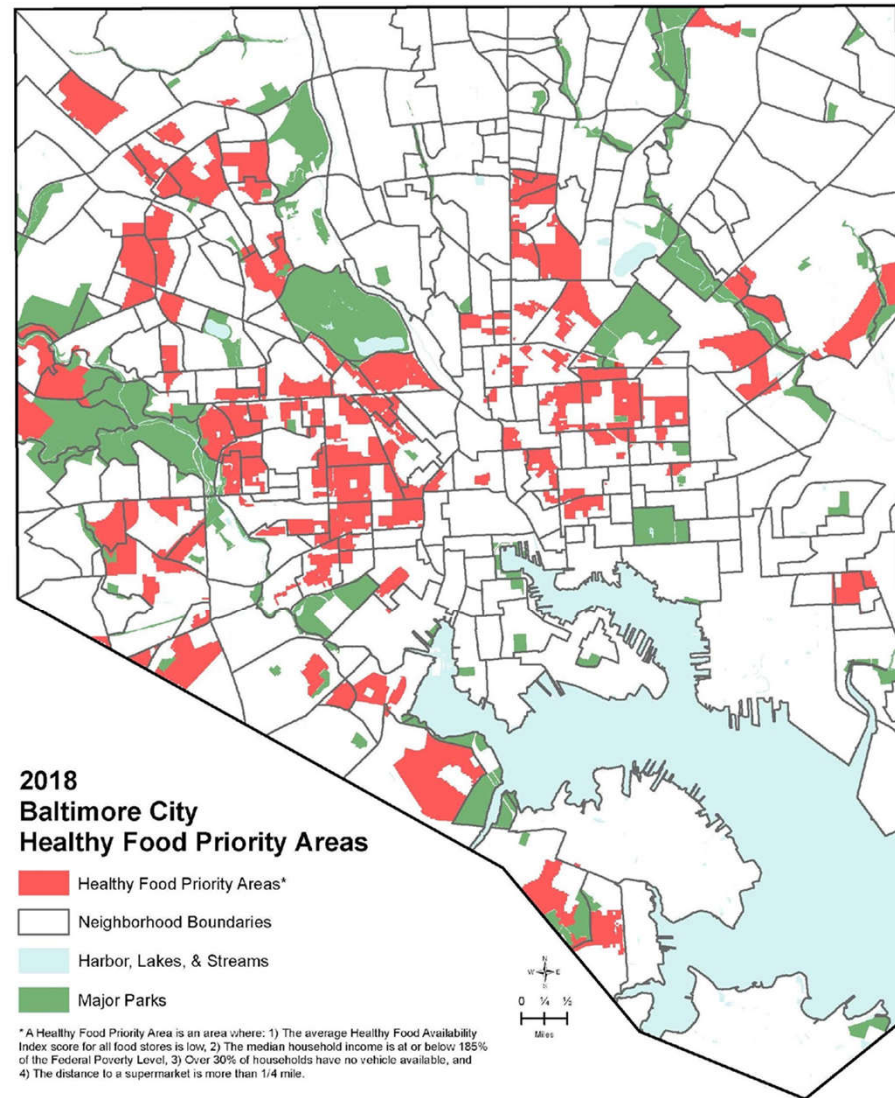

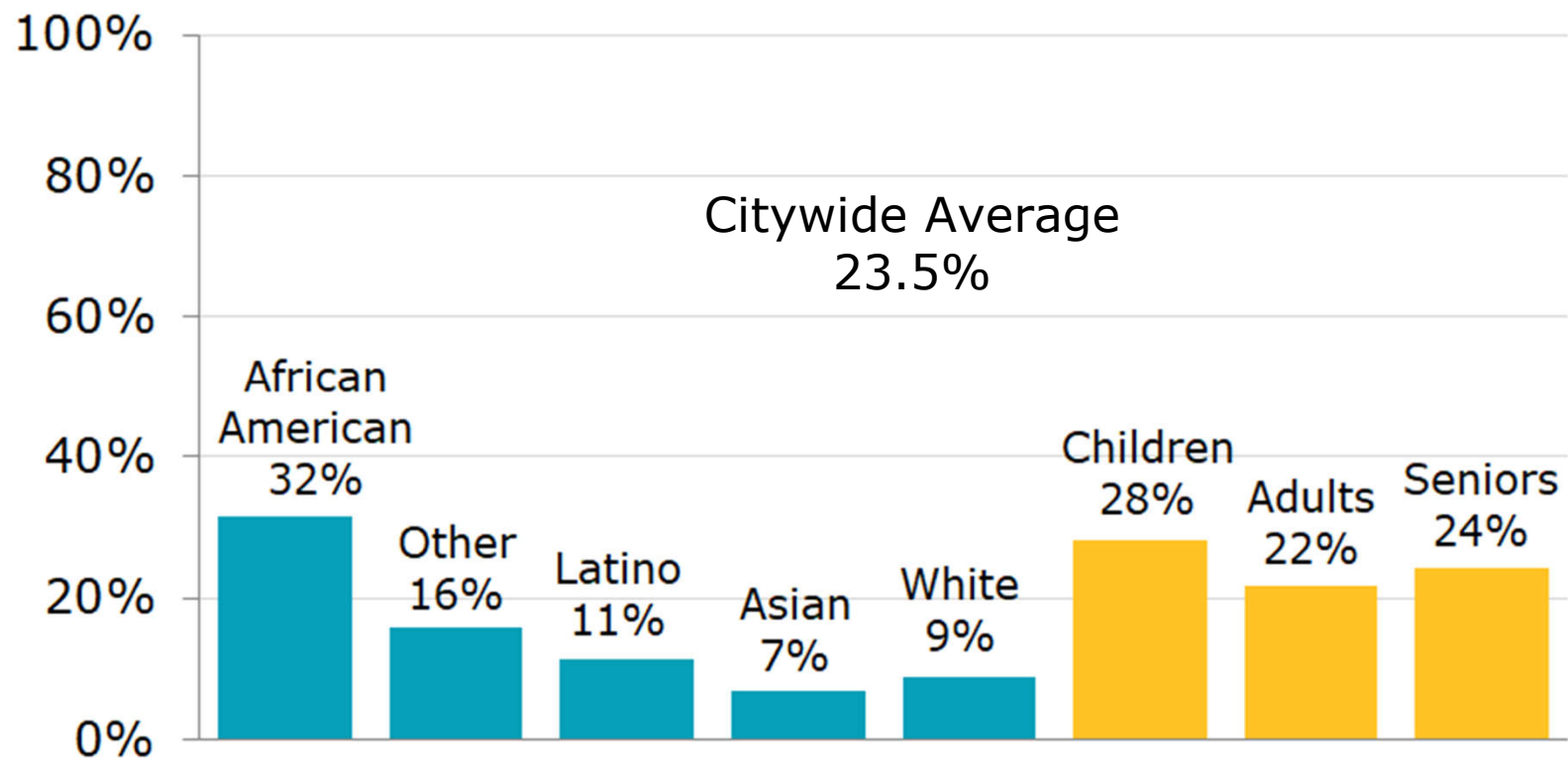

# Improving Access to Healthy Foods in Baltimore City

- Baltimore City Health Department (BCHD) Virtual Supermarket
  - Online grocery ordering and delivery at designated public housing, low-income senior housing, libraries
- BCHD Healthy Corner Stores
  - Stock and sell fruits, vegetables, whole grain foods, low-fat dairy, healthy snacks, etc.

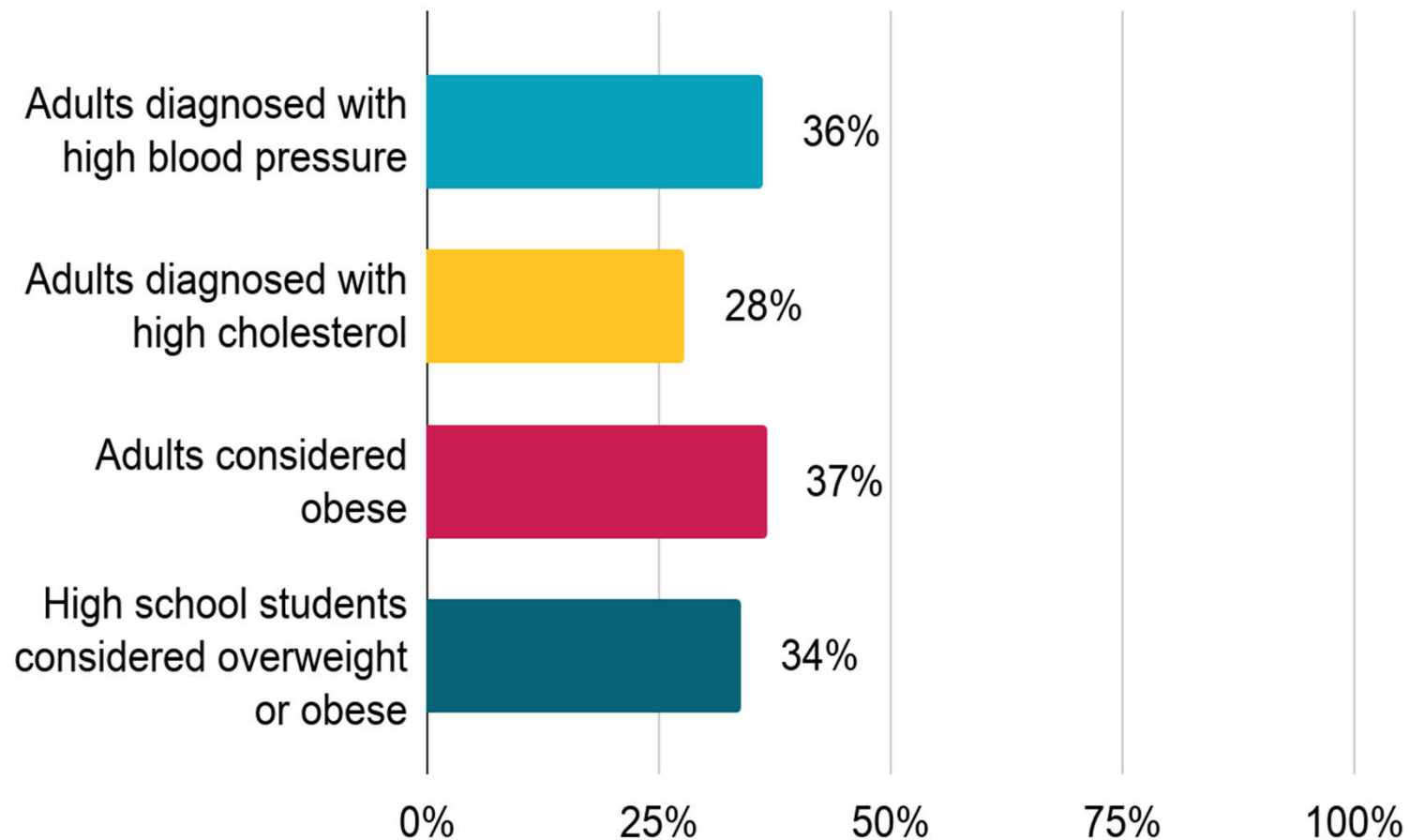

# Percent of Residents Affected by Various Chronic Diseases, 2017



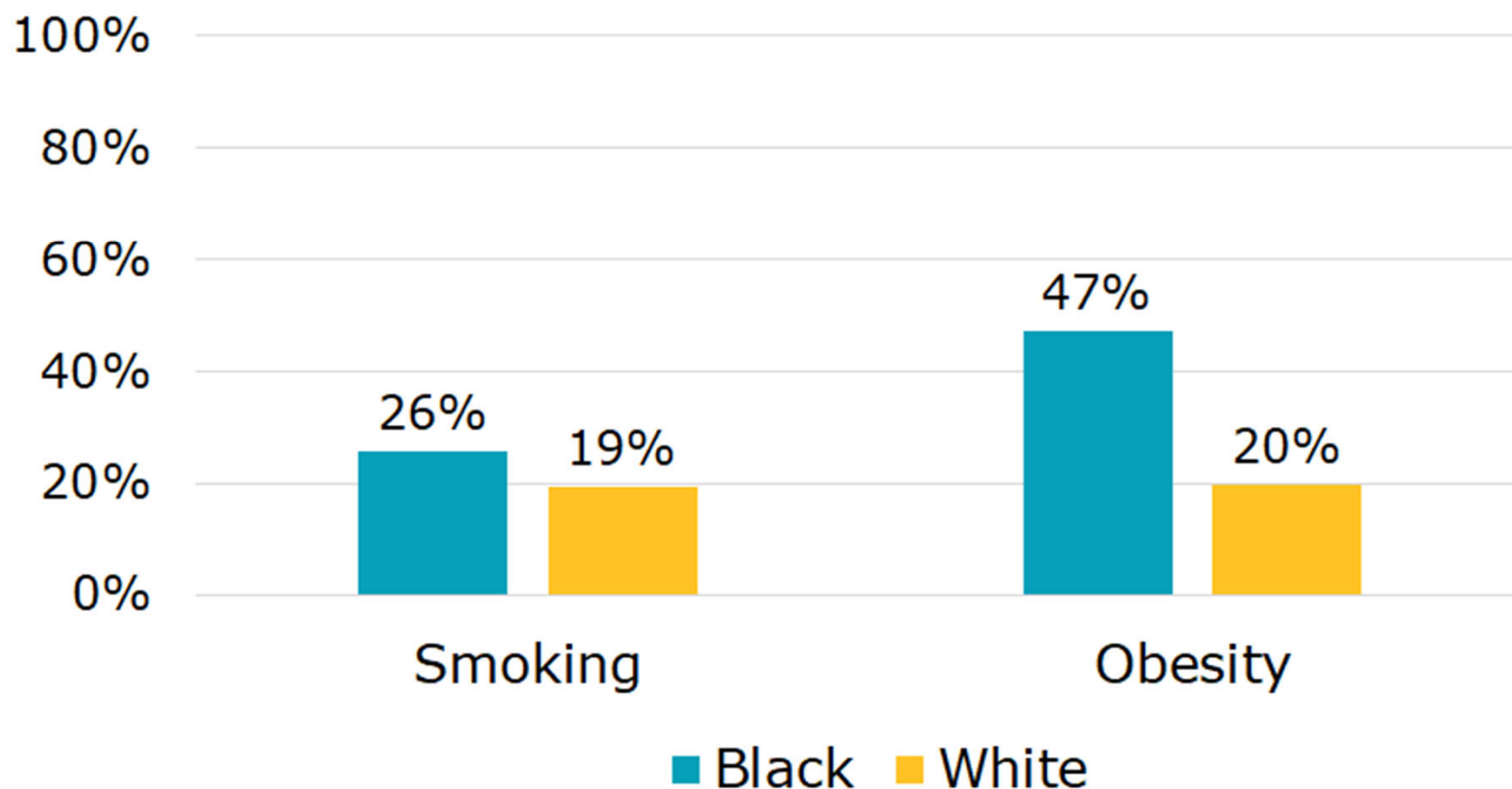

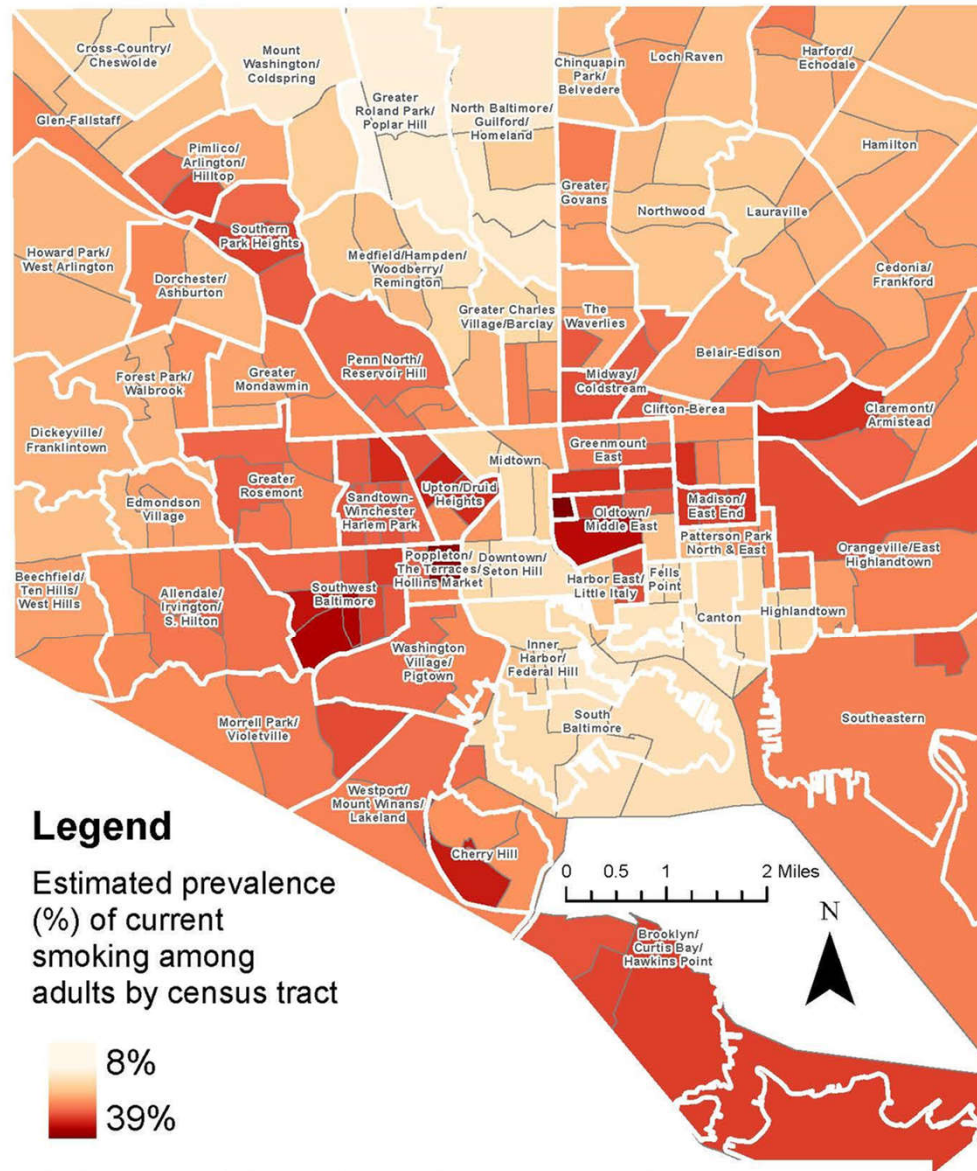

# Estimated Prevalence of Current Smoking among Adult Residents by Census Tract with CSA Boundaries (white outlines), Baltimore City, 2016



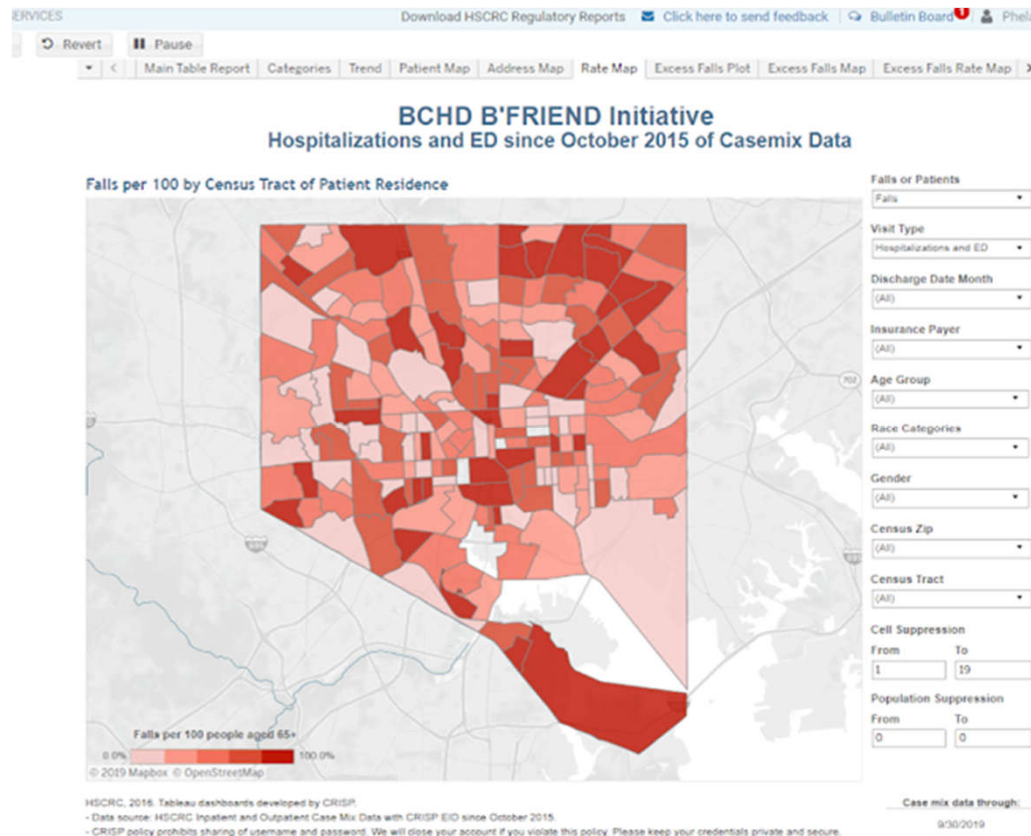

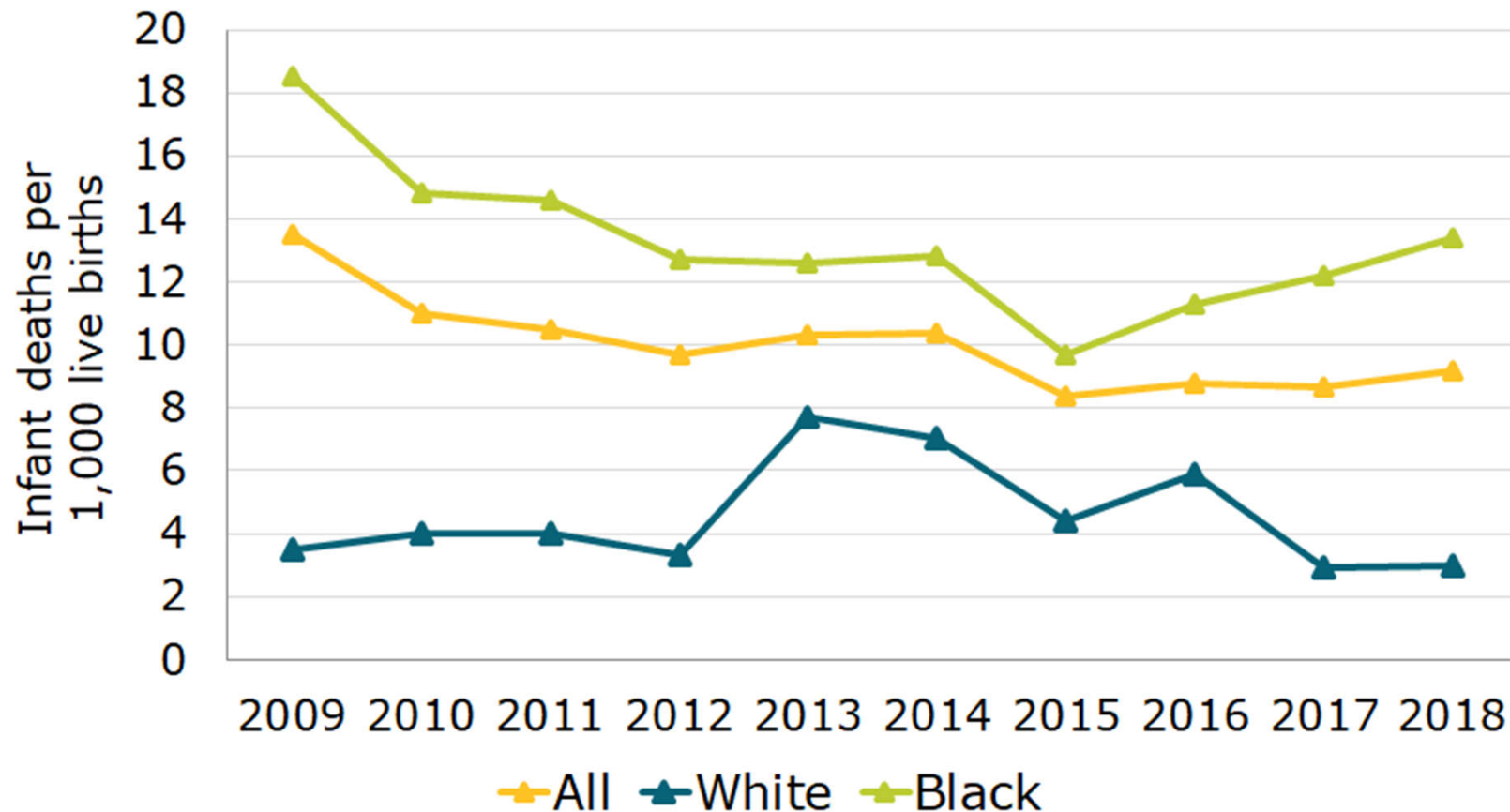

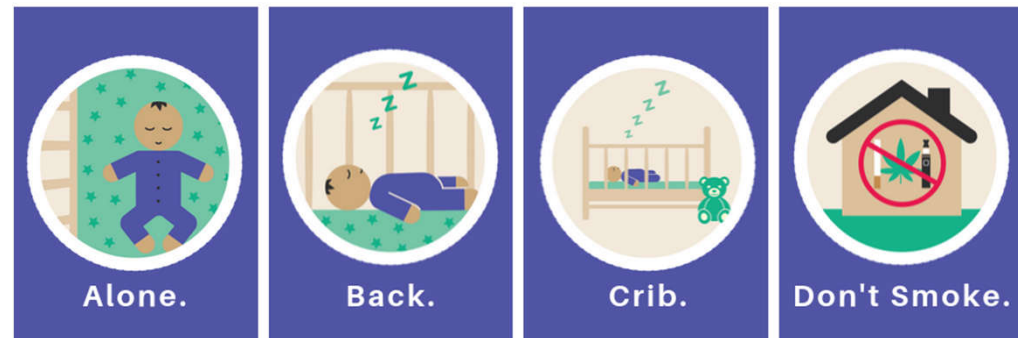

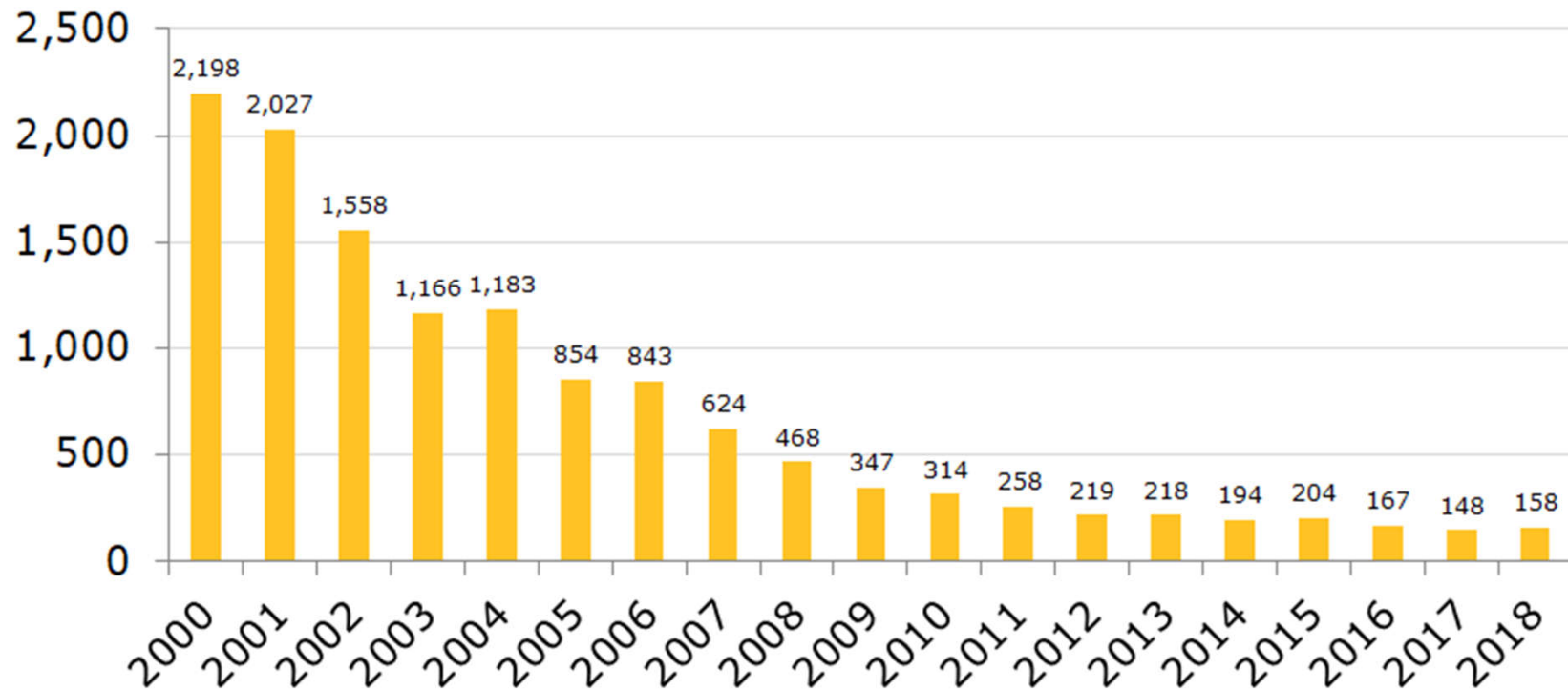

( $\geq 10\text{mg/dl}$ ), 2000-2018**



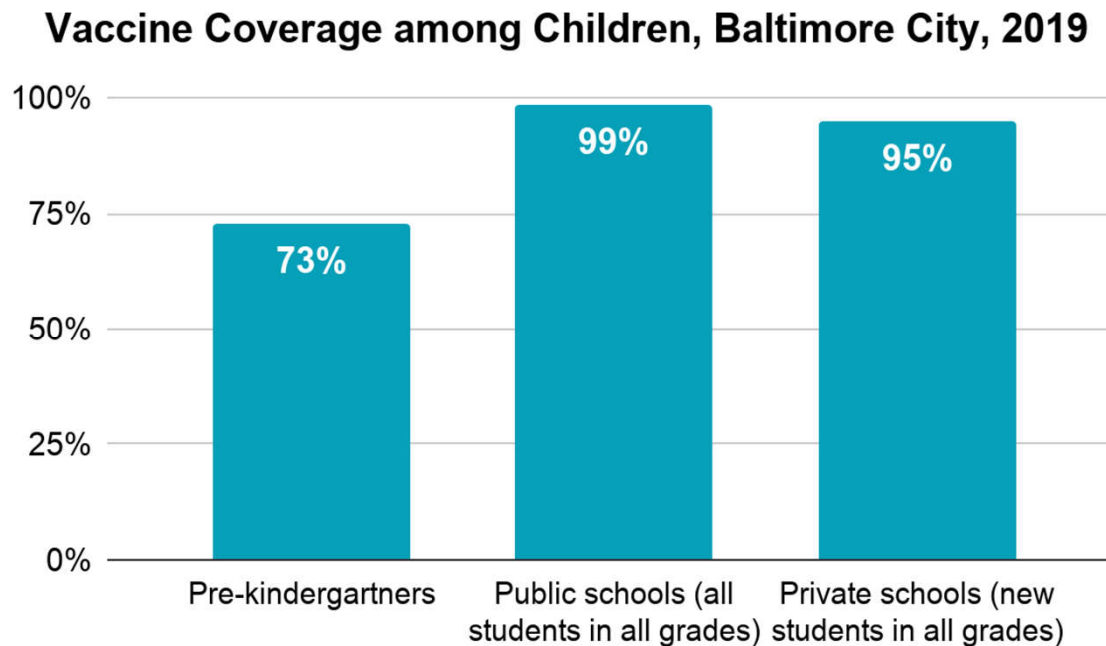

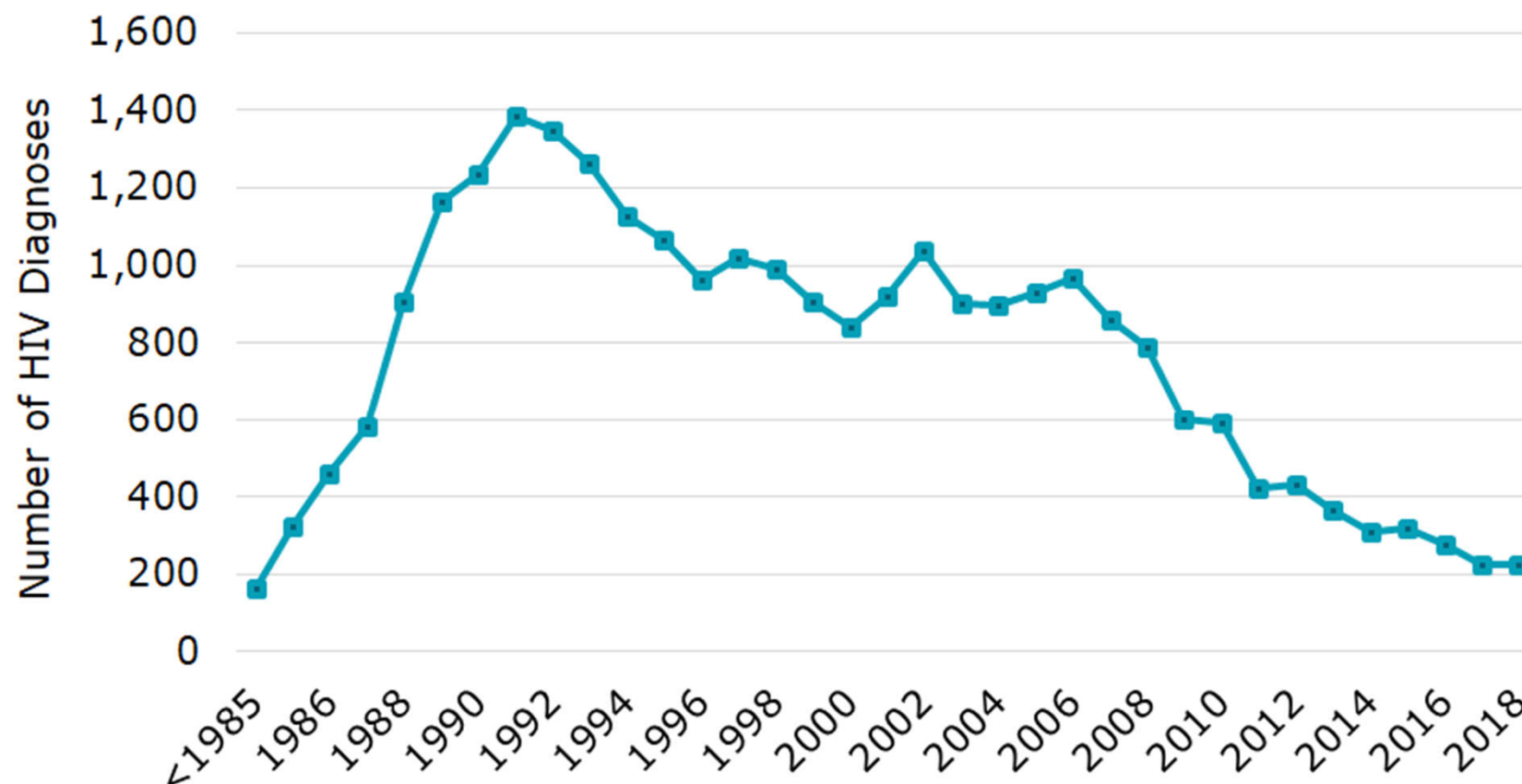
