 (1) ALL MEMBER'S TERMS EXPIRE AT THE END OF THE MAYOR'S TERM.
 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM. EACH MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL
 - (2) AT THE END OF A TERM, EACH MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
 - 6 (B) COMPENSATION; EXPENSES.
 - 7 THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION:
 - (1) SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION; BUT
- 9 (2) ARE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR REASONABLE EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE 10 PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES, AS PROVIDED IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES.

- 16 (II) BUDGET, FINANCE, AND TAXATION;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
