

The Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) is in receipt of City Council Bill #19-0479, for the purpose of establishing a tax credit against the property tax imposed on the principal residences of certain low-income employees of the City of Baltimore; imposing certain limitations, conditions, and qualifications for credit eligibility; providing for the amount, duration, and administration of the credit; defining certain terms; and providing for a special effective date.

CHAP has no objection to the bill as the proposed tax credit will have no impact on designated historic properties in Baltimore City.
