## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning 1 2 City Streets - Opening -Two Three-Foot Alleys Bounded by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, 3 Park Avenue and Mulberry Street 4 5 FOR the purpose of condemning and opening two three-foot alleys, bounded by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, Park Avenue, and Mulberry Street, as shown on Plat 303-A-18 in the Office of 6 the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date. By authority of 8 Article I - General Provisions 9 10 Section 4 11 and Article II - General Powers 12 13 Sections 2, 34, and 35 Baltimore City Charter 14 15 (1996 Edition) 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Department of Transportation shall proceed to condemn and open two three-foot alleys, bounded 17 by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, Park Avenue, and Mulberry Street, and more particularly 18 19 described as follows: 20 Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the south side of Wilson Alley 12 feet wide and the west side of a 3-foot alley, the point of 21 beginning being distant Easterly 75.0 feet, more or less, measured along the south 22 side of Wilson Alley from the east side of Tyson Street 20 feet wide; thence 23 binding on the south side of Wilson Alley, Easterly 3.0 feet, more or less, to the 24 25 east side of the 3-foot alley; thence binding on the east side of the 3-foot alley, 26 Southerly 46.3 feet, more or less, to the end thereof; thence crossing the 3-foot alley, Westerly 3.0 feet, more or less, to the west side of the 3-foot alley and 27 thence binding on the west side of the 3-foot alley, Northerly 46.3 feet, more or 28 29 less, to the place of beginning.

**EXPLANATION:** CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

1 Containing 138.9 square feet or 0.003 acres, more or less. Beginning for Parcel No. 2 at the point formed by the intersection of the north 2 3 side of Inloes Alley 12 feet wide and the east side of a 3-foot alley, the point of beginning being distant Westerly 78.9 feet, more or less, measured along the north 4 side of Inloes Alley from the west side of Park Avenue 66 feet wide; thence 5 6 binding on the north side of Inloes Alley, Westerly 3.0 feet, more or less, to the west side of a 3-foot alley; thence leaving the north side of Inloes Alley and 7 binding on the west side of the 3-foot alley, Northerly 40.0 feet, more or less, to 8 the south side of the property known as 410 Park Avenue; thence binding on the 9 property, Easterly 3.0 feet, more or less, to the east side of a 3-foot alley and 10 thence binding on the east side of the 3-foot alley, Southerly 40.0 feet, more or 11 12 less, to the place of beginning. Containing 120.0 square feet or 0.003 acres, more or less. 13 As delineated on Plat 305-A-18, prepared by the Survey Section and filed on April 26, 2019, in 14 the Office of the Department of Transportation. 15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the proceedings for the condemnation and 16 opening of the alleys and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in 17 accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and 18 regulations adopted by the Director of the Department of Transportation and filed with the 19 Department of Legislative Reference. 20 **SECTION 3.** AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is 21 22 enacted.
