Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairman Reisinger read the bill number, title, purpose, and confirmed that the public notice requirements were met.
- 2. Councilwoman Clarke explained the Neighborhood Commercial Establishment use in the Zoning Code and the purpose of the bill.
- 3. Committee members and agency representatives discussed the definition of accessories under the bill and how the bill would affect existing stores selling covered products.
- 4. Eric Tiso reviewed the Planning Commission's report and suggested amendments. He noted that the Planning Commission approves of the amendment option selected by Councilwoman Clarke and the Department of Legislative Reference.
- 5. Derek Baumgardner explained that the Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals has no objections to the bill.
- 6. Katy Byrne reviewed the concerns raised in the Department of Housing and Community Development's written report and noted that it supports the amendments proposed by the Planning Commission. She also discussed issues related to enforcement of the ordinance if it is enacted.
- 7. Representatives from the other reporting agencies confirmed the recommendations in their written reports.
- 8. The Committee voted to recommend the bill favorably with the amendments drafted by the Department of Legislative Reference (see attached).
