- 1. Vice-Chair Sneed read the bill number, title, and purpose.
- 2. President Scott explained the importance of and the need for the bill.
- 3. Representatives from the reporting agencies confirmed the recommendations in their written reports.
- 4. Committee members and agency representatives discussed the scope of the bill and potential amendments. The Committee considered and adopted the amendments suggested by the Law Department. President Scott noted that his office would follow up regarding the other amendments discussed and that they could be proposed on second reader if needed.
- 5. Members of the public testified in support of the bill. Speakers explained the problems faced by residential tenants during the COVID-19 emergency and gaps in the current measures in place to protect them. Members of the public also testified about the challenges that landlords are facing during the emergency and potential difficulties landlords could have implementing the bill as it is drafted.
- 6. The Committee voted to recommend the bill favorably with amendments.
