In recent weeks there has been an explosion of news and happenings surrounding the death of two unarmed black civilians across the nation by police hands, as well as discussions surrounding the culture of police brutality in America. This had led me to find out that there has been a proposition to increase the Baltimore Police Department to \$545,000,000 in the next fiscal year. I am writing this message in hopes that you may provide liaison to the concerns and needs of residents of Baltimore and myself in the upcoming BBMR budget hearings for FY 2021. Despite the need to provide protection services to a population of almost six hundred thousand people, i strongly urge that the increase in the BPD budget, as well as a substantial portion of its remaining budget, be reallocated toward social services and education. Historically, the city police budget has been vastly greater than the budgets allocated for public health, homeless services, youth services, and other vital agencies. After years of using a 'tough on crime' strategy in Baltimore, its time for Baltimore to reevaluate its priorities. With the budget realities of post-COVID Baltimore, and the disgusting display that police across the country have displayed in the wake of the killing of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor, its time to look at our budget priorities.

We cannot keep using the line that the police department is a state agency, and that we do not have control. We control the \$509 million that is given to the department, as well as the IT and facilities support they get from other parts of the budget. Every year we keep doing the same thing, it is another year that we traumatize residents of Baltimore. We cannot say that we are a trauma-responsive city when we are still causing the trauma. That's called gaslighting.

The liabilities are endless. The obvious ones are the mounting long term liabilities because of the pension costs we are accumulating, including the \$150.5 million from this year. The less tangible ones are the abuses we are inflicting on our residents, actively through the abuses of the police, and passively by the lack of investment in truly supporting our residents.

It is unacceptable to look at the abuses of the Gun Trace Task Force, chalk them up to a 'few bad apples', and give the police more money.

Since 2010, we have spent \$4.74 billion in city funds on the Baltimore Police Department. This model is not working. Cut the BPD's budget so we can start a discussion about where we can allocate that money. Rolling the budget back to 2014 levels would give us another \$100 million to use, and would allow us to spend the next year discussing how we can disband the BPD.

I am clinical social worker that works with formerly homeless women and families. If ever there is a situation where one might think the police "should" be called, my clients and I do everything we can to find another solution. We know the situation can turn on them with one expression of exasperation or frustration. Most of my clients have significant histories of trauma, the chances of them being triggered by aggressive, bullying behavior/body language often exhibited by police high. Baltimore does not have a crime problem, it has a intergenerational trauma problem. Trauma is not fixed by force but by safety and compassion (and mental health treatments like EMDR and Neurofeedback). I make less than \$30/hr working for a non-profit. Like teachers buying books and supplies for their classrooms, I spend thousands of dollars each year trying to get the training and tools I need to help my clients. Their needs are great and the right treatments require resources beyond a talk therapist helping them to "make better choices." The costs of not treating them are greater—addiction, homelessness, child abuse, domestic violence—trauma begets trauma. The police only exacerbate these problems. Defund the police and put more money into health health care, child care, housing, job training. Invest money in mental health resources and care only available to the wealthy (quality inpatient mental health care for women and their children, Neurofeedback, clinician trainings in modalities effective for treating Complex-PTSD such as Internal Family Systems (IFS) Therapy, Somatic Experiencing, Brainspotting, and EMDR. Hurt people hurt people. You only get healing through care.
