during a hearing and for voting; and providing for a special effective date.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Title 3. Outline of Code Administration
Subtitle 2. Administrative Agencies and Officials
§ 3-202. Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals.
[(j) Public hearings – Member must be present to participate.]
[A member of the Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals may not participate in a hearing unless the member is physically present at the hearing.]

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is 10 enacted. It will remain effective through August 31, 2020, and immediately after that date, with 11 12 no further action by the Mayor and City Council, this Ordinance will be abrogated and of no further effect. 13
