11 12	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE , That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

16	Part 5. Commercial Vehicles and Trailers
17	§ 6-26. Commercial vehicles.
18	[(a) "Commercial vehicle" limited.]
19	[In this section, "commercial vehicle" does not include a vehicle that:
20 21	 has a maximum gross vehicle weight of less than 7,000 pounds and a manufacturer's rated capacity of ³/₄ ton or less;

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1 2 3	 (2) except for a passenger car (as defined in Maryland Vehicle Law § 11-144.1), has no commercial advertising on the exterior of the vehicle or on any equipment attached to the vehicle;

5	(4) is designed to carry 15 or fewer passengers.]
6	(A) [(b)] Stopping by residence.
7 8 9 10	(1) Except as otherwise specified in this section, no vehicle with a maximum gross vehicle weight of more than 20,000 pounds and no commercial vehicle may park, stand, or stop longer than 1 hour continuously on any street, lane, or alley in front of or adjacent to any property used or intended to be used as a residence.
11 12 13	(2) This subsection does not apply to a commercial vehicle that is parked for the purpose of doing any public or private work for or on behalf of any person located within a radius of 1 block from the property used or intended to be used as a residence.
14	(B) [(c)] Nighttime hours.
15 16 17 18	Except as otherwise specified in this section, no vehicle with a maximum gross vehicle weight of more than 20,000 pounds and no commercial vehicle may park, stand, or stop longer than 1 hour continuously between the hours of 1 a.m. and 7 a.m. on any street, lane, or alley of the City.
19	(C) [(d)] <i>Exceptions</i> .
20	This section does not apply to:
21	(1) vehicles of the Police Department or the Fire Department; [or]
22	(2) emergency vehicles belonging to:
23	(i) the City;
24	(ii) any public utility; or
25	(iii) any volunteer ambulance service[.];
26 27	(3) PRIVATE PASSENGER VEHICLES, INCLUDING AUTOMOBILES, MINIVANS, PASSENGER VANS, STATION WAGONS, AND SPORT UTILITY VEHICLES;
28	(4) PICKUP TRUCKS; OR
29 30	(5) PANEL-BODY DELIVERY TRUCKS WITH LESS THAN 1,500 POUNDS (3/4 OF A TON) MANUFACTURER'S RATING CAPACITY.
