on behalf of MDOT MPA submitted an application for modification of a permit to discharge an average of 6.76 million gallons per day of stormwater runoff exposed to stabilized dredged materials from a dredged material containment facility, located at Hart Miller Island, which is near the mouth of Back River, Essex, MD, to the Chesapeake Bay (Use II waters).

The Denartment proposes to re-issue the permit with Outfall 003 eliminated.

The Associated Jewish Community Federation of Baltimore, inc., 101 West Mount Royal Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland 21201 submitted an application to renew a permit to discharge an average of 9,625 gallions per day of treated wastewater from the Peanstsone Family Camp located at 5425 Mt. Gileact Road, Reisterstown, Maryland to groundwater via subsurface soil absorption systems at Outfall 001 and Outfall 002.
