I wanted to be at the budget on Friday, June 12, 2020 and speak in front of the budget committee;

Who do I talk to and how to I get my comments recorded in the budget hearing? Police were surrounding the entrance to the building on Friday June 12, 2020 so I couldn't go in the building to find out how to do this and make myself be heard.

A knot churned in my the pit of my gut when I listened to Ms. Marilyn Mosby tell the budget committee she wanted more money to continue to be this transparent office and keep the public safe.

I wanted to inform the committee of my efforts to find out from her whether her office is still investigating the death of Officer Jimmy Dale Halcomb in 1976 at Lombard and Carey Streets. The police are investigating a murder where someone pleaded guilty to doing it and can't retract a guilty plea. Is that how the police investigators spend their time? The wife of the slain officer, Officer Halcomb's wife, thinks the case is over and done with and yet I can't get an answer from Mosby's office as to whether or not they are investigating? Is the case over and done with? Why won't the Baltimore city's states attorney's office confirm the ongoing investigation?

Ms. Mosby hasn't gained my public trust.

Why would Mosby even offer a new trial to John Earl Williams in 2016 when the murder weapon has never been identified? If you don't have a weapon then how do you prove beyond a reasonable doubt that some one killed some one else? You need a weapon to do a ballistics report. Something smells rotten in Denmark. The budget committee needs to check her reports before they approve the additional money she asks for her office.

Can you help get me to the right person? I need to talk to them about the budget which Ms. Mosby is asking for and make my comment on this budget. I also need to make the same comment for the police budget. A forty four year "investigation" costs a lot of money.

I want my comments part of the official public record.

I will send you a three minute video clip of me speaking in Annapolis about this same issue.

I want the video clip as part of my official public comment on the proposed Baltimore city states attorneys' budget and police budget. If the police are still investigating a murder after forty four years then they are spending a lot of money and it needs to be highlighted. Someone needs to put a careful eye on this extensive spending. This is on top of a million dollar trial to consist John E. Williams.
