Analysis

Current Law

The rules, regulations and mandates pertaining to the Trauma-Informed Care Task Force are found in the:

- Baltimore City Code
 - Article 1 Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies, under Section 22

Background

If approved, Council Bill 20-0510 would increase the Task Force by one member and would include the following updates and/or qualification changes for some appointees:

- The number of <u>ex-officio members</u> appointed <u>would decrease</u> from eight (8) to seven (7)
- The members appointed by the Mayor <u>would increase</u> from twenty-eight (28) to thirty (30)
 - Two members shall be educators within the BCPSS (update)
 - Of the 30 members appointed by the Mayor, the Council President recommends eight

 (8) members; currently two (2) out of the eight (8) recommended by the Council President are to be Councilmembers. However, per this legislation the two councilmembers recommended <u>one would have to</u>:
 - Have experience as an educator in the BCPSS, (qualification changed) and the other
 - Have experience as a parent of a student within the BCPSS (qualification changed)
- The bill also clarifies which member of the task force will serve as co-chair.

As of this writing, six (6) agency reports are in and attached hereto; none in opposition, however, two (2) agencies has recommended changes and/or amendments.

- 1. The Department of Planning (recommends having an alternate option for appointing a Councilmember with experience an educator in the BCPSS just in case no one on the Council meets those qualifications in future years)
- 2. The Baltimore City Public School (proposes an amendment: would like for the CEO of the BCPS to be able to recommend the two members that are required to be educators within the BCPSS)

Per the primary sponsor of the bill, the legislation will allow voices of teachers to be heard.




I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 20-0510 introduced by Councilmembers Cohen, Clarke, Henry, Sneed, Dorsey, Burnett, Middleton, Bullock, Schleifer, Stokes and President Scott.

The purpose of this bill is for adding 2 educators with experience within the Baltimore City Public School System to the Trauma-Informed Care Task Force; clarifying that one Councilmember appointed to the Task Force have substantial experience as an educator with the Baltimore City Public School System; clarifying that one Councilmember appointed to the Task Force have substantial experience as a parent with the Baltimore City Public School System; clarifying that the appointed Councilmember with substantial experience as an educator shall be co-chair of the Task Force; conforming and correcting related provisions; and providing for a special effective date.

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC) has reviewed the proposed legislation and has determined that it does not negatively affect any of its programs or initiatives. The PABC defers to those departments and agencies most directly involved.

Letter of Support Baltimore City Council Ordinance 20-0510 Trauma-Informed Care Task Force Composition – Revisions and Clarifications

May 11, 2020

As drafted, Council Ordinance 20-0510 proposes to add two educators with experience within the Baltimore City Public School System to the Trauma-Informed Care Task Force. It also clarifies that one Councilmember appointed to the Task Force have substantial experience as an educator within the Baltimore City Public School System, as well as one Councilmember appointed to the Task Force have substantial experience as a parent within the Baltimore City Public School System. Finally, it requires the Councilmember with significant experience as an educator to serve as co-chair of the Task Force.

After careful review, Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) is pleased to express support for Council Ordinance 20-0510. It is critical to have the voice and perspective of City Schools educators present in the Task Force because our educators are with our students all day, every day and often have a particularly valuable and unique understanding of what our students are experiencing and how this affects both their learning and their overall wellbeing. Furthermore, our educators are especially well-positioned to provide insight into what teachers and other schoolbased staff need in order to be able to best support our students affected by trauma and promote healing through our schools and in our communities.

We respectfully request an amendment to clarify that the two educators be designated by the City Schools CEO.

The addition of two City Schools educators to the Trauma-Informed Task will assist with ensuring teacher voice is an essential part of the forthcoming critical discussions. For these reasons, City Schools respectfully urges a favorable report of Council Ordinance 20-0510.

Position: Does Not Oppose

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 20-0510, Trauma-Informed Care Task Force Composition—Revisions and Clarifications, the purpose of which is revise the appointments for the Trauma-Informed Care Task Force.

Background

The Elijah Cummings Health City Act, enacted in February 2020, established the Trauma-Informed Care Task Force. The Task Force, comprised of 35 members, is tasked with assisting in the development and oversight of a trauma-response strategy for the City. This legislation increases the board to 37 members by adding two Task Force members that are educators in Baltimore City Public Schools, appointing an additional City Councilmembers, and removing the ex-officio member from City Council. In addition, the legislation specifies qualifications for the two City Councilmembers appointed to the Task Force.

Fiscal Impact

The legislation does not have a fiscal impact for the City.

Conclusion

The legislation changes the composition of the Task Force, but does not change the function or the resources required to support the Task Force.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance does not oppose City Council Bill 20-0510.
