**INTRODUCTION** – City Streets - Closing - 2 Portions of East Cromwell Street

**PURPOSE/PLANS** – For the purpose of condemning and closing 2 portions of East Cromwell Street between the south side of East McComas Street and the east side of West Peninsula Drive, as shown on Plat 347-A-77 in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date.

**COMMENTS** – This bill looks to authorize the condemning and closing of a two sections of Cromwell Street located in South Baltimore’s Port Covington. The condemning and closing of these two sections of Cromwell Street are being sought in tandem with the ongoing realignment and reconstruction of Cromwell Street to accommodate the redevelopment of Port Covington.

**AGENCY/DEPARTMENT POSITION** – The portion of Cromwell Street that is to be realigned and reconstructed has been closed to vehicular traffic since January 2020. The Department of Transportation has **no objection** to City Council bill 20-0538.
