### **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Councilman Stokes, the primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks. He talked about why the Resolution was introduced and stated, "We must make sure our seniors are safe."
- 2. The chairman discussed the agency reports with the agency representatives, asking them if he/she had any additional information to report.
- 3. Bill Wells, Housing Authority of Baltimore City (HABC) testified; beginning by stating he does not speak on behalf of HUD. Some highlights of his conversation were:
  - Is HUD funded
  - Rental Assistance Demonstration Program (RAD)
    - Talked about the RAD Program
    - Housing Authority role(s) in the Program and with the Buildings associated with same
    - About some of the properties and the type of tenants there
  - He also mentioned that eight (8) representatives were in attendance to talk about the oversight of the properties and to answer questions
- 4. Angela Cameron, also representing the HABC, Private Housing Department talked about what the department does and stated the Department works closely with the private housing firms. She also introduced the property managers.
- 5. Councilman Stokes addressed the property managers saying, "I am interested in having the sanitization schedule posted in common areas, something visible. Can this be done? I would like to see this happen."
- 6. Some of the responses, comments and/or concerns from the property managers were:
  - Talked about how they sanitize buildings
  - Encourages social distancing
  - Talked about site visits to the different buildings
  - Concern: Would like "time window" established to post information on a given day
  - Managers should have some flexibility on what they post
  - Suggestion: To post a list of the daily cleaning and signing off on same
  - Talked about what they can and will post; will definitely post information in the future
  - One issue: Not every property is situation the same which calls for different protocol for cleaning but will keep a log for cleaning and/or sanitization in the future
- 7. Councilwoman Clarke stated, "I believe all information posted should be the same; making sure it is uniformed. What will the signs to say? And, when the managers come up with what will be posted please submit a copy of the findings to the committee."

- 8. Committee member Reisinger asked, "What are your cleaning practices for the senior housing located in Cherry Hill." Marsha Blunt responded by talking about the cleaning processes and stated, we don't post the cleaning processes but will in the future.
- 9. Bill Wells, HABC, informed the committee that he would forward an additional appendix to the committee members when the plans are submitted to him by the managers. And stated, "From what I am understanding you want to make sure tenants know we are sanitizing."
- 10. Councilman Stokes gave closing remarks, "We are focusing on COVID and sanitizing, not just on regular cleaning. This is what we want; not both (sanitizing and regular cleaning) mixed together. Not now, but when possible let us know what kind of timeline will be used for posting."
- 11. Vote taken. Hearing concluded.
