Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilman Stokes, the primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks. He talked about the importance of sanitizing city-owned building for the safety of the employees."
- 2. The chairman discussed the agency reports with the agency representatives, asking them if he/she had any additional information to report.
- 3. ChiChi Nyagah-Nash, Department of General Services along with other Department representatives testified. Some highlights of their conversations were:
 - Talked about the processes involved for the three (3) levels of cleaning:
 - Regular cleaning
 - Sanitization defined what is it and processes for same
 - Decontaminations and disinfectant processes
 - decontamination is expensive and costly to do!
 - There is a 60 to 90 day applied rule for decontamination
 - Also talked about the procurement process for decontamination
 - Talked about type of vendors used for cleaning
- 4. Councilman Reisinger gave some comments pertaining to the preparation of and planning for employees to returning to work. Is there a model or protocol for screening, such as cameras, he asked? Director Nyagah-Nash talked about:
 - The upcoming employees' screening guidelines that is initiated by the Department of Human Resources:
 - Is called "Emocha Health Screening Program"
 - o All city employees will be required to be screened before entering the workplace
 - o The upcoming roll out for same
 - o All employees will receive training on the Emocha application
 - o Very few public are allowed in city buildings at this time
- 5. Councilman Stokes asked Director Nyagah-Nash to talk about how the Department plan to post information pertaining to the sanitization of the buildings. Director Nyagah-Nash talked about the efforts completed thus far to begin posting information in the buildings.
- 6. Vote taken. Hearing concluded.
