Re: City Council Bill 20-0499 – City Streets - Closing - Inloes Alley and Two Three-Foot Alleys Bounded by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, Park Avenue, and Mulberry Street

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 20-0499 for the purpose of condemning and closing Inloes Alley and two three-foot alleys bounded by Tyson Street, Wilson Alley, Park Avenue, and Mulberry Street, as shown on Plat 303-A-18A in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date.

At its meeting of March 28, 2019, the Planning Commission reviewed City Council Bill 20-0499 and found that these alleys are no longer needed for a public purpose and may be closed and sold.

If enacted Council Bill 20-0499 will allow for the assembly of property for the redevelopment of a large parcel in this block and is a companion piece of legislation to Council Bill 20-0498 and Council Bill 20-0500.

Collectively the bills help to consolidate adjacent properties into a larger developable parcel. The larger parcel will likely be redeveloped into a mixed-use property involving a blend of new construction and restoration of existing historical buildings.

DHCD has no objection to the passage of City Council Bill 20-0499.
