5	products at no cost; defining certain terms; providing for a special effective date; establishing

27 28 29	(2) LICENSED OTHER TOBACCO PRODUCTS RETAILER, AS DEFINED IN STATE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE § 16.5-101(E) {"LICENSED OTHER TOBACCO PRODUCTS RETAILER"}.

1	(B) RETAILERS REQUIRED TO SELL NICOTINE REPLACEMENT THERAPY PRODUCTS.
