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- FOR the purpose of requiring that owners of certain vacant structures to the Department of
 Housing and Community Development conspicuously post on the exterior of the structure
 certain vacant structures certain information regarding the ownership of the structure;
- 5 requiring that the sign meet certain specifications; specifying when signs must be posted;
- 6 dedicating a certain portion of the fine proceeds to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund;
- 7 repealing a provision requiring that certain vacant structure registration information be

18	§ 4-1. Definitions.
19	(f) Person.
20	(1) In general.
21	"Person" means:
22	(i) an individual;
23	(ii) a partnership, firm, association, corporation, or other entity of any kind; [and]

25	(iii) a receiver, trustee, guardian, personal representative, fiduciary, or
26	representative of any kind.
27	(2) Inclusions.
28	"Person" includes, except as used in [§ 4-13] § 4-15 {"Penalties"} of this subtitle, a

1	(i) Vacant structure.
2	(1) In general.
3 4	"Vacant structure" means any structure that is subject to an unabated violation notice issued under § 116 {"Unsafe Structures"} of the Baltimore City Building Code.
5	(2) Exclusions.
6 7	"Vacant structure" does not include an accessory structure that is not intended for occupancy, such as a garage, shed, or storage building.
8	§ 4-6. Registration statement – Contents.
9	(a) In general.
10 11	Each registration statement must be in the form that the Commissioner requires and contain the following information:
12	(1) a description of the premises by street number or by block-and-lot;
13 14	(2) the name, street address, telephone number, and email address of the premises' owner of record;
15 16	(3) the name, street address, telephone number, and email address of the premises' managing operator, if other than the owner; and
17 18 19 20	(4) if the owner is a corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability company, or similar entity, the name, street address, telephone number, and email address of a natural person who serves as the owner's chief executive officer, managing partner, or managing member, or in a similarly authoritative position.
21	(b) Change of listed information.
22 23 24	The Commissioner must be notified within 10 days of any change in the identity of or contact information for the owner of record or any other person listed in the registration statement.

29 30 31 32	THE OWNER OF A VACANT STRUCTURE MUST AFFIX, IN A POSITION THAT IS CONSPICUOUS AND VISIBLE FROM THE STREET OR ROAD FRONTING THE PROPERTY, A SIGN CONTAINING THE INFORMATION SET FORTH IN § 4-6(A) {"REGISTRATION STATEMENT – CONTENTS: IN GENERAL"} OF THIS SUBTITLE.

1	THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT SHALL AFFIX, IN A
2	POSITION THAT IS CONSPICUOUS AND VISIBLE FROM THE STREET OR ROAD FRONTING THE
3	PROPERTY, A SIGN CONTAINING:

14	(2) REGISTRATION AMENDMENTS.
15	IF THE OWNER OF A VACANT STRUCTURE AMENDS A REGISTRATION UNDER § 4-6(B)
16	{ "REGISTRATION STATEMENT CONTENTS: CHANGE OF LISTED INFORMATION"} OF
17	THIS SUBTITLE, THE OWNER MUST MAKE ANY COMMENSURATE SIGN CHANGES WITHIN
18	10 DAYS OF FILING THE AMENDMENT WITH THE COMMISSIONER.
19	(C) VACANT STRUCTURES IN DEFAULT OR FORECLOSURE.
20	IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, IF
21	THE PROPERTY IS IN DEFAULT OR IN FORECLOSURE, THE SIGN REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION
22	MUST ALSO INCLUDE THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF ANY CREDITORS
23	OR LIEN HOLDERS.
24	(D) SIGN SPECIFICATIONS.
25	A SIGN REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION MUST BE:
26	(1) IMPERVIOUS TO WEATHER CONDITIONS;
27	(2) LEGIBLY WRITTEN IN A FONT SIZE OF NOT LESS THAN 18 POINTS; AND
28	(3) NO SMALLER THAN 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ INCHES BY 11 INCHES IN SIZE.
29	(E) <i>Fine proceeds</i>.
30	50% OF THE FINES COLLECTED BY THE CITY FOR VIOLATIONS OF SECTION MUST BE
31	DEPOSITED IN THE CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND CREATED BY CITY CHARTER, ARTICLE
32	I, § 14 {"Affordable Housing Trust Fund"}, to be used exclusively for the
33	PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN THAT SECTION, SUBJECT TO APPROPRIATION PURSUANT TO THE

13	(a) In general.
14 15 16	In addition to any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement procedure, this subtitle may be enforced by issuance of an environmental citation as authorized by City Code Article 1, Subtitle 40 {"Environmental Control Board"}.
17	(b) <i>Process not exclusive</i> .
18 19	The issuance of an environmental citation to enforce this subtitle does not preclude pursuing any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement action authorized by law.
20	§ 4-15 <u>4-17</u> . [§ 4-14.] Penalties.
21	(a) In general.
22 23 24	Any person who violates a provision of this subtitle or of a rule, regulation, or order adopted or issued under this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than \$500 for each offense.
25	(b) [Each day a separate offense] CALCULATING OFFENSES.
26	(1) IN GENERAL.
27 28	EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, EACH [Each] day that a violation continues is a separate offense.
29	(2) Posting requirement.
30 31	Each week that a violation of § 4-12 {"Vacant structure: Posting requirement"} of this subtitle continues is a separate offense.

1 (b) Each day a separate offense.

2 Each day that a violation continues is a separate offense.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
 Ordinance.

6 **SECTION 3.** AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 180th 7 day after the date it is enacted.
