1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

3 FOR the purpose of designating Indigenous Peoples' Day, observed on the second Monday in
4 October, as a legal holiday for the City of Baltimore; and generally relating to the observance
5 of certain holidays by the City.

6 BY adding

7 Article 1 - Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

8 Section(s) 36A-1 and 36A-2, to be under new subtitle, "Subtitle 36A. Legal Holidays"

11 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the
12 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15 style="text-align:center">**SUBTITLE 36A. LEGAL HOLIDAYS**

16 **§ 36A-1. HOLIDAYS SPECIFIED.**

17 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

18 IN ADDITION TO OTHER LEGAL HOLIDAYS ESTABLISHED FROM TIME TO TIME BY UNION
19 CONTRACT, BY AGENCY REGULATION, OR BY ACTION OF THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES, THE
20 FOLLOWING DAYS ARE LEGAL HOLIDAYS FOR THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.

21 (B) *INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY.*

22 INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY, THE SECOND MONDAY IN OCTOBER OF EACH YEAR.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law.
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

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1 **§ 36A-2. OBSERVANCE.**

2 THE CITY SHALL OBSERVE THE LEGAL HOLIDAYS SPECIFIED IN § 36A-1 OF THIS SUBTITLE
3 ANNUALLY, IN THE SAME MANNER AS IT OBSERVES OTHER LEGAL HOLIDAYS ESTABLISHED
4 FROM TIME TO TIME BY UNION CONTRACT, BY AGENCY REGULATION, OR BY ACTION OF THE
5 BOARD OF ESTIMATES.

6 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
7 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
8 Ordinance.

9 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
10 enacted.
