17	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
18	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

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1	§ 10-4. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY.
2	(A) CREDIT GRANTED.
3 4 5	In accordance with State Tax-Property Article \S 9-252, there is a 100% property tax credit for real property located within the City of Baltimore that is:
6 7	(1) OWNED BY HABITAT FOR HUMANITY WITH THE INTENTION OF RELINQUISHING OWNERSHIP IN THE NEAR FUTURE;
8 9	(2) USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF DEVELOPMENT, REHABILITATION, AND TRANSFER TO A PRIVATE OWNER; AND
10 11	(3) NOT OCCUPIED BY ADMINISTRATIVE OR WAREHOUSE BUILDINGS OWNED BY HABITAT FOR HUMANITY.
12	(B) ANNUAL REPORT.
13 14 15	In order to receive the credit granted by this section, Habitat for Humanity shall submit an annual written report on or before June 30 each year to the Mayor and City Council documenting:
16 17	(1) ALL OF HABITAT FOR HUMANITY'S REAL PROPERTY HOLDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF BALTIMORE; AND
18 19	(2) ALL TRANSACTIONS INVOLVING HABITAT FOR HUMANITY'S REAL PROPERTY HOLDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.
20	(C) TERM OF CREDIT.
21 22 23	THE TAX CREDIT FOR EACH ELIGIBLE PROPERTY SHALL CONTINUE UNTIL THE PROPERTY IS TRANSFERRED FROM HABITAT FOR HUMANITY TO ANOTHER ENTITY, BUT IN NO EVENT FOR MORE THAN 5 YEARS.

26 27	THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE SHALL ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS IN ORDER TO IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER THIS SECTION.

30 31 32	(I) SHALL INCLUDE PROCEDURES NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR AND THE GRANTING OF A PROPERTY TAX CREDIT UNDER THIS SECTION; AND

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1 2	(II) MAY INCLUDE PROCEDURES FOR GRANTING PARTIAL CREDITS FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR LESS THAN A FULL TAXABLE YEAR.
3	(3) FILING WITH LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE.
4 5 6	A COPY OF ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE MUST BE FILED WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BEFORE THEY TAKE EFFECT.
7 8 9	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
10 11	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
