The Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation has no objection to City Council Bill #20-0607:

FOR the purpose of Naming an unnamed alley, located in the rear of 216 East Biddle Street, between Hunter Street and Guilford Avenue, Mura Alley. The bill proposes the change for an alley located between the 1200 block of Hunter Street and the 1200 block of Guilford Avenue. The alley is located within the Mount Vernon Historic District and uses a street name that is consistent with other alleys located between Preston and Biddle Streets through East Baltimore.

The Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) finds that the proposed name change will not impact any historic buildings. Further, the proposed name is already used for other alleys in Baltimore City between Biddle and Preston Streets which run at about the same location at blocks 1200 north.

CHAP has reviewed CC Bill 20-05607 at the October 13, 2020 hearing and unanimously supports a finding of no objection to the proposed naming of an unnamed alley, located in the rear of 216 Est Biddle Street, between Hunter Street and Guilford Avenue, Mura Alley.
