Charter Amendment - City Council - Reduction in Size

Sponsor: Councilmember Bill Henry Introduced: February 10, 2020

Purpose:

For the purpose of reducing the size of the City Council; providing for certain members to be elected at large; requiring that the President of the City Council, the Council Vice-President, and the Council's representative to the Planning Commission be at-large members of the Council; clarifying, correcting, and conforming certain language; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the City for adoption or rejection.

Effective: Upon the approval of the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City.

Charter Amendment – City Council – Composition

Sponsor: Councilmember Ryan Dorsey

Introduced: February 24, 2020

Purpose:

For the purpose of increasing the size of the City Council to 15 members elected from districts; requiring that the City Council President be elected by the City Council from among its members every 2 years; clarifying the terms and the manner of election for the Council Vice President and the Council representative to the Planning Commission; allowing for the City Council to remove a member from the position of President; specifying that the City Council elect an individual to fulfill a mayoral vacancy; conforming and clarifying related provisions; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the City for adoption or rejection.

Effective: Upon the approval of the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City.

Analysis

Background

Since 1922, the Baltimore City Council had consisted of 18 council members, with three members elected from each of the six districts. In November 2002, voters of Baltimore City approved a Charter Amendment to create a new structure for the Baltimore City Council. The restructured Council consist of 14 council members, each elected from a single-member district.

 The Council shall consist of 14 members in addition to the President. There shall be 14 districts with one member elected from each district. At the same time that they elect the members, the voters shall elect from Baltimore City at large, a person to be the President of the City Council. 	 The Council consist of 9 members to be elected as follows: 1 member from each of 6 districts; and 3 members from the city at large. 	
	 The City Council shall, by a majority vote of its members, appoint from the at-large members: Council President; Council Vice President; Planning Commission representative.

Same as above.	• The Council shall consist of 15 members. There shall be 15 districts with one member elected from each district.	
	 President – At its first regular session in each even-numbers calendar year, the City Council shall, by majority vote of its members, appoint from its members a President who shall preside over the City Council, vote on all questions, and perform other duties as prescribed by law. 	
	• Vice President – Process shall be the same as it is for President.	
	• Planning Commission member – Process shall be the same as it is for President.
