AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Indigenous Peoples' Day

FOR the purpose of designating Indigenous Peoples' Day, observed on the second Monday in
October, as a legal holiday for the City of Baltimore; and generally relating to the observance
of certain holidays by the City.

BY adding

Article 1 - Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies
Section(s) 36A-1 and 36A-2, to be under new subtitle, "Subtitle 36A. Legal Holidays"
Baltimore City Code
(Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Baltimore City Code

Article 1. Mayor, City Council, and Municipal Agencies

SUBTITLE 36A. LEGAL HOLIDAYS

§ 36A-1. HOLIDAYS SPECIFIED.

(A) *IN GENERAL.*

IN ADDITION TO OTHER LEGAL HOLIDAYS ESTABLISHED FROM TIME TO TIME BY UNION
CONTRACT, BY AGENCY REGULATION, OR BY ACTION OF THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES, THE
FOLLOWING DAYS ARE LEGAL HOLIDAYS FOR THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.

(B) *INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY.*

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY, THE SECOND MONDAY IN OCTOBER OF EACH YEAR.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law.
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.
Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment.
~~Strike out~~ indicates matter stricken from the bill by
amendment or deleted from existing law by amendment.


1 **§ 36A-2. OBSERVANCE.**

2 THE CITY SHALL OBSERVE THE LEGAL HOLIDAYS SPECIFIED IN § 36A-1 OF THIS SUBTITLE
3 ANNUALLY, IN THE SAME MANNER AS IT OBSERVES OTHER LEGAL HOLIDAYS ESTABLISHED
4 FROM TIME TO TIME BY UNION CONTRACT, BY AGENCY REGULATION, OR BY ACTION OF THE
5 BOARD OF ESTIMATES.

6 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
7 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
8 Ordinance.

9 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
10 enacted.




