



Midtown Community Benefits District has been in existence since the mid-1990's, serving the communities of Bolton Hill, Charles North, Madison Park and Mount Vernon. Property owners within the Midtown Community Benefits District catchment area pay an additional 13.2 cents per \$100 of assessed property value in the form of a surtax. The surtax is in addition to the City of Baltimore's standard property tax rate and supports supplemental services within the boundaries of Midtown Community Benefits District. The Department of Transportation foresees no significant fiscal or operational impact from the passage of Council Bill 20-0484.

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 19-0465, Port Covington and Port Covington Community Benefits District Management Authority, the purpose of which is to establish a Port Covington Community Benefits District and Management Authority.

Background

There are several Community Benefits Districts across the city: Waterfront, Midtown, Charles Village, and Downtown. These Community Benefits Districts, and the Management Authorities that preside over them, provide additional services to their residents such as street cleaning, alley maintenance, and safety patrols. These services are funded by a property tax surcharge paid by property owners in the District.

Fiscal Impact

Port Covington is still in the early stages of development; therefore, we cannot estimate the number of properties that would be subject to the surcharge. Note that since Port Covington is a TIF district, baseline property taxes will first go to pay the TIF bond debt service.

Conclusion

If this legislation passes and is approved by property owners to establish the Port Covington Community Benefits District, it will establish an agreement between the area's property owners and the District, in which property owners pay a supplemental tax rate, on top of the of the City's property tax rate, for additional services. There is no direct cost or revenue impact to the City.

In light of recent events and the economic downturn caused by COVID-19, it is important to note that these additional surcharges add to an already high tax burden on property owners and have the potential to discourage investments. This increased tax burden has the potential to limit the City's flexibility to increase General Fund revenues in the future.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance does not oppose City Council Bill 19-0465.

At its regular meeting of January, 30, 2020, the Planning Commission concurred with the recommendations of its departmental staff, and recommended that City Council Bill 19-0465 be passed by the City Council. The Bill creates a Business Improvement District (BID) for the purpose of funding specific additional services. The additional services to be provided within the BID will include; beautification and landscape maintenance, snow removal, sanitation services, additional security, marketing and promotions, events, and fundraising efforts. DHCD does not anticipate that the provision of these additional services within the BID will have an adverse fiscal or operational impact on the Department.

DHCD has no objection to the passage of City Council Bill 19-0465.

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 20-0484 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would renew and continue the Midtown Community Benefits District and Management Authority for another four years.

The District was created by Ordinance 95-0613 pursuant to authorization from the Maryland General Assembly that allowed the City to create community benefits districts. See 1994 Md. Laws ch. 732, codified in City Charter, Art. II, §63. In 1997, the General Assembly passed a law requiring that it reauthorize community benefits districts every four years, but in 2000 transferred the reauthorization function to the Mayor and City Council. See 1997 Md. Laws ch. 655; 2000 Md. Laws ch. 89, codified in City Charter, Art. II, §§63(g); (h)(1)(iii). The reauthorization requirement specific to the Midtown Benefits Management District and Management Authority has been codified in Section 7-16 of Article 14 of the City Code.

This bill is the required reauthorization pursuant to that section, which the Law Department approves for form and legal sufficiency.



I am herein reporting on Mayor and City Council Resolution 20-0484 introduced by Council Members Costello and Stokes.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Resolution is to renew and continue the Midtown Community Benefits District and Management Authority; provide for a special effective date; and generally relating to the activities and authority of the Midtown Community Benefits District and Management Authority.

BRIEF HISTORY

The Midtown Community Benefits District, an area of approximately 17 acres, includes the neighborhoods of Bolton Hill, Charles-North, Eutaw Place, and Mount Vernon-Belvedere. The District and Management Authority were established to promote the area; provide supplemental security and sanitation and promotional services; provide public amenities; and generally improve the quality of life in the area. In order to fund these operations, the District is designated as a special taxing district. A Board of Directors governs the Authority and includes one Mayoral representative, one City Council representative, one business representative, two non-profit representatives, two representatives from each of the four community organizations in the District, and four at-large members.

The enabling Ordinance requires the City Council to hold a public hearing every four years to evaluate the activities and undertakings of the Authority and the District, and to determine whether the District and Authority should continue for an additional four years.

- Resolution 03-043 continued the District and Authority for an additional one-year period, ending June 30, 2004.
- Resolution 04-052 continued the District and the Authority for a full four-year period, ending June 30, 2008.
- Resolution 08-001 continued the District and Authority until June 30, 2012.
- Resolution 12-017 continued the District and Authority until June 30, 2016.
- Resolution 16-028 continued the District and Authority until June 30, 2020.





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Ordinance 95-613 (the "Ordinance") authorized the creation of the Midtown Community Benefits District (the "District") and the Management Authority (the "Authority"), subject to certain terms and conditions.

The Ordinance requires that the Mayor and City Council hold 1 or more public hearings every 4 years to evaluate the activities and undertakings of the District and the Authority and to determine whether the District and Authority should continue for another 4 years.

In 1999, the City Council conducted the first of these quadrennial reviews and, by Resolution 99-019, continued the District and Authority for an additional 4 years, ending June 30, 2003. Subsequently, Chapter 89, Acts of 2000, amended Charter Article II, § 63(h), establishing a new 4-year review cycle, to begin December 2003. In 2003, the Mayor and City Council conducted an interim review and, by Resolution 03-043, continued the District and Authority for an additional 1-year period, ending June 30, 2004. In 2004, the Mayor and City Council conducted a further review and, by Resolution 04-052, continued the District and Authority for a full 4-year period, ending June 30, 2008. In 2008, the Mayor and City Council conducted a further review and, by Resolution 08-001, continued the District and Authority for an additional 4-year period, ending June 30, 2012. In 2012, the Mayor and City Council conducted a further review and, by Resolution 12-007, continued the District and Authority for an additional 4-year period, ending June 30, 2016. In 2016, the Mayor and City Council conducted a further review and, by Resolution 16-028, continued the District and Authority for an additional 4year period, ending June 30, 2020.

The Mayor and City Council has now undertaken a new, quadrennial review for the 4-year period beginning July 1, 2020. Based on its review of the activities and undertakings of the District and Authority, the Mayor and City Council finds that the renewal and continuation of the District and the Authority are in the best interests of the citizens of Baltimore.

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Midtown Community Benefits District and Management Authority are renewed and continued for an additional 4 years, ending June 30, 2024.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution takes effect when it is enacted.
