- FOR the purpose of requiring city-owned or -occupied buildings to place a notice regarding the
 human-trafficking prevention hotline in certain locations; deleting an obsolete reference to
 the "Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation"; providing that certain
 businesses may obtain the required human-trafficking notices from the United States
 Department of Homeland Security's Blue Campaign website; and conforming and clarifying
 related provisions.

19 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the 20 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

6	(1) IN GENERAL.

17	§ 42-2. Human trafficking prevention signs to be posted.
18	(a) Applicability.
19	The requirements of this section apply only to:
20	(1) adult-entertainment businesses;
21	(2) food service facilities;
22	(3) hotels; and
23	(4) permit holders.
24	(b) <i>In general</i> .
25 26	(1) The owner of any business described in subsection (a) of this section must post a sign that states the following:

12	(i) be at least 3 by 5 inches in size;

15 16	(iii) draw attention to the phone number of the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline by showing the phone number in bold type.
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	(3) The owner of a business as provided in subsection (a) of this section may meet the requirements of this subsection by creating their own signs, using a font size of not less than 30 points for the hotline numbers and a font size of not less than 12 points for the body text, or using copies of the signs created and made available online by the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation under Maryland Business Regulation Article § 15-207 if the signs are altered to indicate that they are required by Baltimore City law rather than State law] THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY'S BLUE CAMPAIGN WEBSITE.

26 27 28 29	(1) Adult-entertainment businesses and food service facilities must post a sign required under this section in a conspicuous place in clear view of the public and employees where similar notices are customarily posted and on the back of the door at the entrance to each restroom.
30 31	(2) Permit holders must post the sign required under this section in a conspicuous place in clear view of the public.
32 33	(3) Hotels must post the sign required under this section on the back of each hotel room entry door.

(d) *Hotels to certify*.

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Beginning in calendar year 2020, any person who owns or operates a hotel within the City must annually certify to the Housing Commissioner, in the form and manner required by the Department of Housing and Community Development, no later than December 31 of each year, that the hotel is in compliance with this section.

8 EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, IN EACH CITY-OWNED OR -OCCUPIED
9 BUILDING, AT LEAST 1 SIGN DESCRIBED IN § 42-2(B) OF THIS SUBTITLE MUST BE POSTED IN
10 EACH:

- (1) LOCATION WHERE THE NOTICE REQUIRED BY SUBTITLE 4 {"WAGES AND HOURS"},
 PART V {"ENFORCEMENT"} OF THE STATE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE IS POSTED;
- 14 (2) PUBLIC RESTROOM; AND
- 15 (3) PUBLIC ENTRANCEWAY OR MAIN LOBBY TO THE BUILDING OR PORTION OF THE
 BUILDING OCCUPIED BY THE CITY.
- 17 (B) FACILITIES OCCUPIED BY THE BALTIMORE CITY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.
- 18 (1) THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE BALTIMORE

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- THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO ANY CITY-OWNED BUILDING THAT IS VACANT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
 Ordinance.
