12 13	WHEREAS , The City Council would like to know what additional functions and particular staff DPW and DHCD need to increase their efficiency in responding to illegal dumping;
14 15 16	WHEREAS , The City Council would like to better understand the role technology currently plays in responding to illegal dumping and what opportunities there are to pursue newer, more capable technology;
17 18	WHEREAS, The City Council would like to understand how DPW and DHCD use data analysis to find areas that are the frequent targets of illegal dumping;
19 20 21	WHEREAS , The City Council would like to better understand the importance of a renewed educational campaign and communication strategy regarding littering and illegal dumping, and the role of each agency in promoting this campaign;
22 23 24	WHEREAS, The City Council would like the know what avenues are worth exploring to increase cooperation between DPW and DHCD and any other agencies that are involved in solving the problem of illegal dumping, such as the Law Department and the Health Department:
