2 3 4	FOR the purpose of requiring the Fire Chief of the Baltimore City Fire Department to report annually certain information to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore; requiring the report to be made available on the Department's website; and providing for a special effective date.

10	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

17 18 19 20	On or before January 31 of each year, the Baltimore City Fire Chief shall report the following information, disaggregated by race and gender (excluding names), from the previous calendar year regarding the Baltimore City Fire Department to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore:	
21	(1) THE NUMBER OF UNIFORMED PERSONNEL WORKING IN FIRE SUPPRESSION AND THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DIVISION:

27 28 29	(4) THE NUMBER OF DISCIPLINE CHARGES FILED AGAINST UNIFORMED PERSONNEL, AS WELL AS THE NUMBER OF CHARGES THAT WERE SUSTAINED AND THE NUMBER OF CHARGES THAT WERE DISMISSED;
30 31	(5) THE NUMBER OF RECRUITING EVENTS IN BALTIMORE CITY THAT THE DEPARTMENT SPONSORED OR PARTICIPATED IN;
32 33	(6) THE NUMBER OF CITIZENS WHO HAVE ADDED THEIR NAMES TO THE CITIZEN CONTACT RECRUITMENT LIST; AND
34 35	(7) THE NUMBER OF COMMUNITY-BASED TOWN HALL MEETINGS ATTENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

1	(C) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.
2 3	THE REPORTS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.
4	(D) REQUIRED PUBLIC HEARINGS.
5 6 7 8 9	(1) THE BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY THE BALTIMORE CITY COUNCIL THAT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT HAS BEGAN THE HIRING PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS FOR ENTRY-LEVEL FIRE SUPPRESSION OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES POSITIONS OR HAS MOVED INTO A NEW PHASE OF THE HIRING PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS FOR THOSE POSITIONS.
10 11 12 13 14 15 16	(2) ON RECEIPT OF NOTICE THAT THE BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT HAS BEGAN THE HIRING PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS FOR ENTRY-LEVEL FIRE SUPPRESSION OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES POSITIONS OR HAS MOVED INTO A NEW PHASE OF THE HIRING PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS FOR THOSE POSITIONS, AN APPROPRIATE COMMITTEE OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COUNCIL SHALL PROMPTLY HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING DURING WHICH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE THE FIRE CHIEF OR THE FIRE CHIEF'S DESIGNEE FIRE DEPARTMENT MUST PRESENT INFORMATION REGARDING:

19 20	(II) THE RECRUITMENT STRATEGY FOR ENTRY-LEVEL FIRE SUPPRESSION OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES APPLICANTS;
21 22	(III) THE RACE, GENDER, AND CITY RESIDENCY DATA OF THE APPLICANTS AT THE CURRENT PHASE OF THE HIRING PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS; AND
23 24	(IV) ANY STEPS TAKEN TO IMPROVE EQUITY IN THE HIRING PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS AND TO REDUCE BARRIERS TO ENTRY.
25 26 27	(3) EACH YEAR, DURING THE THIRD WEEK OF JULY, AN APPROPRIATE COMMITTEE OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COUNCIL SHALL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING DURING WHICH THE FIRE CHIEF OR THE FIRE CHIEF'S DESIGNEE MUST PRESENT INFORMATION REGARDING:
28 29	(I) THE OVERALL PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS FOR ENTRY-LEVEL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES POSITIONS;
30 31	(II) THE RECRUITMENT STRATEGY FOR ENTRY-LEVEL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES POSITIONS;
32 33	(III) THE RACE, GENDER, AND CITY RESIDENCY DATA OF THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES APPLICANTS; AND
34 35 36	(IV) ANY STEPS TAKEN TO IMPROVE EQUITY IN THE PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROCESS AND TO REDUCE BARRIERS TO ENTRY FOR ENTRY-LEVEL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES POSITIONS.

2 3	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
4 5 6 7	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the first reports under this section shall be due on or before January 31, 2021 within 90 calendar days after the effective date of this Ordinance, and shall include information from each of the previous 5 calendar years; thereafter, each report need only include information from the previous calendar year.
8	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED. That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
