Human-Trafficking Notice Requirements – Modifications

Sponsor: Councilmember Kris Burnett

Introduced: February 8, 2021

Purpose:

For the purpose of requiring city-owned or -occupied buildings to place a notice regarding the human-trafficking prevention hotline in certain locations; deleting an obsolete reference to the "Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation"; providing that certain businesses may obtain the required human-trafficking notices from the United States Department of Homeland Security's Blue Campaign website; and conforming and clarifying related provisions.

Effective: This Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day after enactment

By adding

Article 15 – Licensing and Regulation; Section(s) 42 – 2.1; Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)

Analysis

If enacted, Bill 21-0038 would require city-owned and occupied buildings to place human-trafficking prevention hotline signage on the premises of these locations in the following manner:

- 42 2.1. City-owned or –occupied buildings.
 - a) In general.

Except as otherwise provided in this section, in each City-owned or -occupied building, at least 1 sign described in Section 42 - 29(b) of this subtitle must be posted in each:

- Location where the notice required by Subtitle 4 {"Wages and Hours"},
 Part V {"Enforcement"} of the State Labor and Employment Article is
 posted;
- 2) Public restroom; and
- 3) Public entranceway or main lobby to the building or portion of the building occupied by the City.
- b) Facilities occupied by the Baltimore City Public School System.
 - 1) The Department of General Services, in consultation with the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, may develop alternate, age-appropriate human-trafficking notice signage for use in City-owned facilities occupied by the Baltimore City Public School System.
 - 2) At a minimum, and alternate sign developed under this subsection shall meet the form requirements set forth in 42 2(b)(2) of this subtitle.
- c) Exception.

This section does not apply to any City-owned building that is vacant.
