
Violence as a Public Health Crisis


- Violence is a public health crisis (APHA, 2018)
- Exposure to trauma and violence linked to negative health outcomes
- Violence is a social determinant of health
- Most often, violence is preventable






Links between Violence and Social Disadvantage





Prevention is Key


- Address "upstream" causes of violence with efforts and resources
 - Policies
 - Programs
- Awareness of structural disadvantages
- Community plays a pivotal role
- Involves key stakeholders





Overview of Legislation: Council Bill 19-0451


- Over 16 named agencies on the TF
- Focus on the Social Determinants of Health
- Analyze available City data from City agencies
- Outline public health and safety strategies





Purpose of the Task Force


- Develop a Citywide violence prevention plan
 - Using a holistic, public health approach that collectively addresses both violence and trauma
 - Address the social determinants of health (SDOH)





Planning Process

- Convened task force members
- Facilitated 8 planning sessions using Results Based Accountability approach
- Posted draft framework public comment
- Pass the torch to the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement to operationalize the plan


- Select results










Violence Prevention Planning Timeline
