11	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
12	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15	Subtitle 7. City Officers and Employees
16	§ 7-10. Residency requirements – City officials generally.
17	(a) Definitions.
18	(1) In general.
19	In this section, the following terms have the meanings indicated.

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1	(2) Agency.
2 3 4	"Agency" means any department, any bureau or division within a department, and any board, commission, authority, council, committee, office, or other unit of City government.
5	(3) Official.
6	"Official" means:
7	(i) the head of an agency who reports directly to the Mayor; and
8 9	(ii) any at-will supervisory employee who reports directly to the Mayor or to the head of an agency.
10	(b) Residency requirements.
11	Every official:
12 13 14	(1) must be a resident and registered voter of Baltimore City at the time of his or her appointment, except only as otherwise authorized by subsection (c) of this section and
15 16	(2) must remain a resident and registered voter of Baltimore City throughout his or her entire term of office.
17	(c) Qualified, short-term exception.
18	(1) In general.
19 20 21	Subsection (b)(1) of this section does not apply to an official who, before her or his appointment, signs a declaration of intent to become a City resident and registered voter within 6 months of the effective date of her or his appointment.
22	(2) Termination for failure to timely comply.
23 24	If the official fails to abide by this declaration of intent within the 6-month period, the official's appointment is automatically terminated at the end of that period.
25	(D) PROHIBITED ACT.
26	(1) IN GENERAL.
27 28 29	NO PERSON MAY REORGANIZE OR OTHERWISE SHIFT INTRA-AGENCY STAFF REPORTING ASSIGNMENTS TO PURPOSEFULLY EVADE THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION FOR HIMSELF, HERSELF, OR OTHERS.

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1	(2) Enforcement.
2	A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION IS AN ETHICS VIOLATION AND ENFORCEABLE BY THE
3	BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF ETHICS UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 8, SUBTITLE 9
4	{"ETHICS - ENFORCEMENT"}.
5	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
5	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
